I am writing to follow up on our meeting of May 21, 2013, and provide written comments pursuant to the Adams County Development Standards and Subdivision Regulations. This is not intended to be an all inclusive list since additional issues may arise during the referral period for your application. Other issues

The following is a short summary of the meeting and the staff recommendation:

During our meeting you stated you wished to add a Dolphin unit to the existing landfill located at 41800 E. 88th Avenue. You requested that this request be processed administratively. The currently approved Certificate of Designation (CD) for a non-hazardous liquid waste solidification facility which allows for treatment to occur as part of the operations. The proposed Dolphin unit will be a change in the process and will require a Major Amendment to the approved CD, subject to final approval by the Board of County Commissioners.

Based on the fact that the current CD expires on August 14, 2014, staff recommends that you address this change in process with the renewed CD application. Based on the timing of your current request and the upcoming expiration date of your CD, staff recommends that you incorporate this change into your renewal application for a more efficient process which will only require one application. Alternatively, you could elect to pursue a Major Amendment to the existing Certificate of Designation. This Major Amendment Application would allow you to request a change in process to allow the Dolphin Unit operation at the CSI Landfill.

As previously stated in a letter from Adams County Planning and Development Department dated July 9, 2012, the process for a Certificate of Designation involves a two-step public hearing process, which is heard by the Planning Commission and the Board of County Commissioner's. Upon completion of each hearing by the Planning Commission, the application for a certificate of designation and the recommendation of the Planning Commission shall be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners shall, after receiving a recommendation from the Planning Commission, hold a public hearing. The Board of County Commissioners shall then approve, approve with conditions, or deny the certificate of designation based on its consideration of the staff report, the Planning Commission's recommendation and findings, the evidence from the public hearings, and the certificate of designation's compliance with the criteria for approval.

This letter is only a reaction to the meeting and discussion we had on June 4, 2013. The initial staff review is only valid for six (6) months and is subject to change with new regulations and/or policies adopted by the County.
