Adams County is a shareholder in eight irrigation ditch and reservoir companies: the Farmers High Line Canal, Brantner, Lower Clear Creek, Colorado Agricultural, Allen, and the Oliver Ditch Companies; and the Burlington Ditch Reservoir and Land Co., and the Wellington Reservoir Company. Ditch business, assessments, etc. are determined by a vote of shareholders. The resolution will authorize Marc Pedrucci and Aaron Clark to vote on ditch matters without having to submit proxy forms for each individual 2017 annual shareholder meetings, as well as serve on the board of directors of some of the ditch companies.

The resolution also authorizes Marc Pedrucci and Aaron Clark to sign four (4) annual renewal contracts with the Lower Clear Creek Ditch Company for the purchase of 120 inches of water rights associated with the Fukaye, Miller, and Elaine T. Valente Open Space Properties. These water rights are used to irrigate agricultural properties that are leased by the County, and were acquired as part of the open space acquisitions along the S. Platte River corridor. The total cost of the water rights for 2017 is \$5,280 and is budgeted by the Parks Dept. annually in cost center 6107 (Open Space Projects Fund).

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RESOLUTION APPROVING ADAMS COUNTY YORK STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT UTILITY RELOCATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN ADAMS COUNTY AND METRO WASTEWATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Transportation ("CDOT") is the owner of public right of way comprising State Highway 224 (the "Site") on which the County intends to construct significant roadway and drainage improvements ("York Street Improvements); and,

WHEREAS, the Metro Wastewater Reclamation District ("Metro District") currently owns and operates a sanitary sewer main, known as the Barr Trunk Interceptor, through the Site; and,

WHEREAS, the construction of the York Street Improvements would conflict with the Barr Trunk Interceptor; and,

WHEREAS, relocation of the Barr Trunk Interceptor through the Site (the "Relocation") would eliminate the conflict; and,

WHEREAS, by means of the attached Utility Relocation Agreement ("URA") the County and the Metro District intend to relocate the Barr Trunk Interceptor as part of the York Street Improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the responsibilities will be shared as outlined in the URA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Adams County York Street Improvements Project Utility Relocation Agreement between Adams County and Metro Wastewater Reclamation District, a copy of which is attached hereto, be approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair is authorized to execute said Utility Relocation Agreement on behalf of Adams County.

ADAMS COUNTY YORK STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT UTILITY RELOCATION AGREEMENT

This Agreement, made and entered into this _____ day of _______, 2017, by and between Adams County, and the Metro Wastewater Reclamation District, a metropolitan sewage disposal district organized and existing pursuant to Part 5 of Article 4 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Colorado, hereinafter referred to as the "Metro District"; each hereinafter referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively referred to as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Transportation ("CDOT") is the owner of public right of way comprising State Highway 224 ("Site") on which Adams County intends to construct significant roadway and drainage improvements ("York Street Improvements"); and,

WHEREAS, the Metro District currently owns and operates a sanitary sewer, known as the Barr Trunk Interceptor, through the Site; and,

WHEREAS, the construction of the York Street Improvements would conflict with the Barr Trunk Interceptor; and,

WHEREAS, relocation of the Barr Trunk Interceptor through the Site, as generally shown on Exhibit A attached hereto, hereinafter referred to as the "Relocation," would eliminate the conflict.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and mutual promises herein contained and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Adams County shall have construction plans and specifications for the Relocation of the Barr Trunk Interceptor prepared as generally shown on Exhibit A.
- 2. The Metro District shall review, provide comments on and in its sole discretion, approve the construction plans and specifications. Metro District standards shall be used to develop the plans and specifications. The Metro District's review shall not be unreasonably delayed.
- 3. Adams County shall pay all of the design and construction costs for the Relocation. In addition, Adams County will be responsible for any costs from damage to existing public or private improvements resulting from the Relocation. However, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as waiving Adams County's protections under the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act.
- 4. Adams County shall arrange for the construction of the Relocation, in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by the Metro District, by a responsible and responsive contractor. The contractor shall carry insurance as set forth below, and the Metro District will be included as an additional insured, except for workers' compensation, on a primary and non-contributory basis. Proof of insurance shall be provided to the Metro District prior to the commencement of construction.

- Commercial General Liability insurance of not less than \$2,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate;
- Workers' Compensation coverage as required by statute;
- Comprehensive Business/Automobile Liability insurance with a combined single limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident;
- d. Builder's Risk insurance covering the work under this Agreement; and
- Contractor's Pollution Liability insurance with limits of \$5,000,000 each occurrence and \$5,000,000 aggregate.
- 5. The Relocation will require wastewater flow management (i.e., by-pass pumping). Adams County shall submit a Wastewater Flow Management Plan ("WFMP") and Discharge Emergency Response Plan ("DERP") that conform with the Metro District's current specifications, Sections 02070 and 02072. Said plans shall be submitted no later than fifteen (15) business days prior to starting construction on the Relocation. Construction on the Relocation shall not begin until the WFMP and DERP have been approved in writing by the Metro District and such construction shall conform to the WFMP as well as all other plans and specifications approved by the Metro District.

A contractor implementing the WFMP and/or the DERP is a contractor to Adams County, not the Metro District. Therefore, Adams County and its contractor will be responsible for compliance with all federal, state and/or local environmental laws and regulations and Adams County and its contractor shall be solely responsible for any noncompliance with those laws or regulations, including notification requirements.

In the event of a spill, overflow or discharge of pollutants, including raw wastewater, which may cause pollution of state waters, Adams County shall immediately notify the following parties:

- Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Spill Report Line, I-877-518-5608; and
- b. National Response Center, 1-800-424-8802.

In addition to the reporting requirements of the paragraph above, Adams County shall immediately notify the Metro District's Process Control Center (303-286-3275) in the event of any spill, overflow or discharge of pollutants to the environment pertaining to the Relocation, regardless of whether or not it may cause pollution of state waters.

6. Adams County shall provide throughout the term of the construction of the Relocation, competent and qualified project administration and quality control. The Metro

For purposes of this paragraph 5, the phrases "discharge of pollutants" and "state waters" shall have the same meanings as in the Colorado Water Quality Control Act, C.R.S. § 25-8-101, et seq.

District shall have the right to visit the Site and inspect the Relocation work at any time and to confer with the Adams County Project Manager.

- 7. The Metro District shall have the right to review and comment on all shop drawings and other contractor submittals pertaining to the Relocation. Adams County shall submit four (4) approved legible copies of such shop drawings and submittals to the Metro District prior to construction of the work described therein. In addition, all shop drawings and other submittals shall be provided to the Metro District as Adobe Portable Document Format (PDF) files.
- 8. Adams County shall notify the Metro District of any change to the construction plans or specifications during construction which involve the Relocation, and shall obtain Metro District approval, not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed, prior to authorizing such change.
- 9. Adams County shall be responsible for obtaining and complying with any permits or approvals necessary from any governmental entity with jurisdiction over the Relocation.
- 10. Adams County and the Metro District shall jointly inspect the Relocation during construction and upon completion of construction, and Adams County shall coordinate and pay for repairs of any defects caused by the Relocation.
- 11. Adams County shall not discharge wastewater to the Relocation until the Metro District has accepted the Relocation for operation and maintenance. The Metro District shall accept the Relocation for operation and maintenance only after the following have been completed:
 - a. Adams County has certified that the entire Relocation has positive slope and the manhole invert elevations are all within 0.04 feet of the design elevations approved by the Metro District.
 - b. Final inspection and approval by the Metro District, which will be based on compliance with all Metro District standards and the submitted plans referred to herein, which will not be unreasonably delayed.
- 12. Ownership of the sanitary sewer line in the Relocation shall be transferred by bill of sale in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B by Adams County upon acceptance of the Relocation by the Metro District.
- 13. Adams County shall warranty the Relocation for a period of one (1) year from the date of acceptance by the Metro District.
- 14. Adams County shall be solely responsible for all claims, costs, losses, damages, suits, administrative proceedings, expenses, liabilities, fines, penalties, and sanctions of every kind (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs, and costs of investigation) incurred by the Metro District, arising out of or resulting from the County's, or its contractor's, negligent performance under this Agreement (hereinafter, "Metro District Losses"). The Parties agree that the scope of this provision includes, but is not limited to, bodily injury or property damage or other Metro District Losses that may arise under (i) any federal

environmental laws or regulations including but not limited to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended by the Superfund Amendment and Reauthorization Act and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act; (ii) any state and local laws; (iii) any regulations, permits, orders, decrees, binding agreements, and other binding obligations relating to the administration of such federal, state and local laws; and (iv) any common-law requirements that relate to the environment, natural resources, health or safety.

- 15. In the event of a default, in addition to any remedies that may be available to the Parties in law or in equity, the Parties shall be entitled to seek specific performance or injunctive relief to enforce the provisions of this Agreement. However, prior to filing legal action, the Party alleging the default shall first provide notice of the default to the other Party and allow a minimum of fourteen (14) days to cure the default.
- 16. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado. The Parties consent to venue for any legal action relating to the Agreement being in the District Court in and for the City and County of Denver. In any legal action for damages or to enforce the terms of this Agreement, except as provided in Section 14, above, the parties shall pay their own attorneys' fees and costs.
- 17. The enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and all rights of action relating to enforcement shall be strictly reserved to the Parties. No third party beneficiary rights shall be created by this Agreement in favor of any person not a Party to this Agreement, unless the Parties mutually agree otherwise in writing.
- 18. Neither Party shall be liable for any failure to perform as required by this Agreement, to the extent such failure to perform is caused by any of the following occurrences: strikes, labor disturbances or disputes, failure of any government (other than the Parties to this Agreement) or third party action or approval required for full performance, riots, civil disorders, war, floods, earthquakes, act of God, explosions, or similar occurrences outside the control of such Party.
- 19. Except as otherwise required in this Agreement, any notice shall be deemed to be validly given at the time that written notice is delivered in person, received by registered mail, postage prepaid, or transmitted by facsimile (with confirmation of receipt) to the following addresses:

- 20. This Agreement is intended as a complete integration of all understandings between the Parties pertaining to the Relocation. No prior or contemporaneous addition, deletion or other amendment shall have any force or effect, unless embodied herein or in a written amendment or other agreement executed by the Parties. This Agreement and any amendments shall be binding upon the Parties, their successors and assigns.
- 21. In the event any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid, void, or otherwise unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of applicable law, such invalid, void, or unenforceable provision shall not affect the validity of the Agreement as a whole and the remainder of the Agreement shall be given full force and effect.

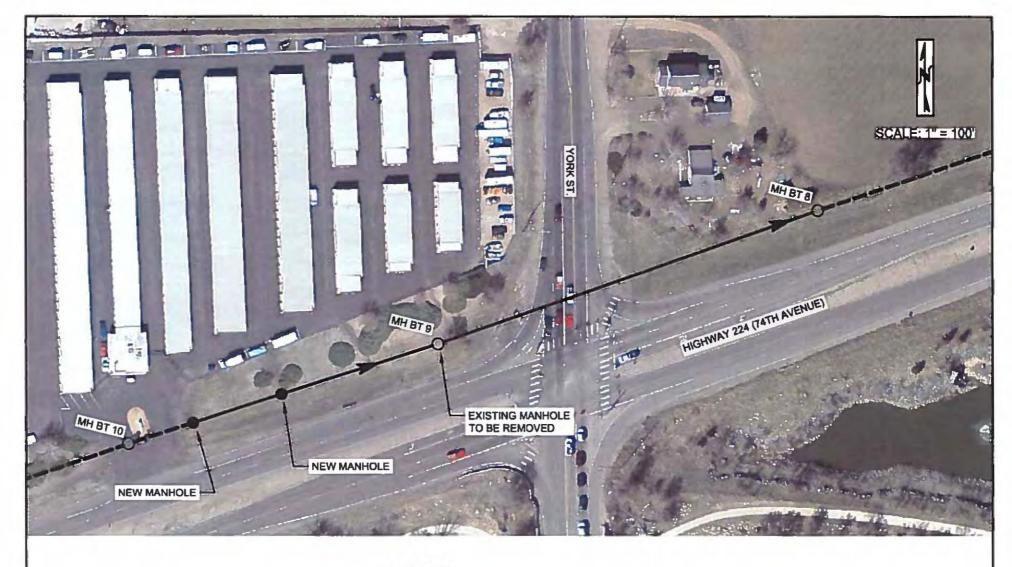

ADAMS COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND PROCEEDINGS

Section One

The Adams County Community Corrections Board, hereinafter referred to as "The Board", has been established pursuant to the authority of §17-27-103 (2), C.R.S., as amended, to oversee all community corrections facilities and programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, including community services programs, and to advise the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado on matters relating to community corrections facilities and programs and such other related issues as may be referred to it by the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

Section Two

The Board shall promulgate such policies, standards and procedures for the conduct of community corrections facilities and programs in Addams County as it deems appropriate. Such promulgation shall be by a vote of the majority of those members of the board attending any meeting of the Board where a quorum has been declared.

Section Three

The Board shall require the submission of budgetary and operational reports from all community corrections facilities and programs, including community services programs, on a quarterly basis and shall review such reports along with all policies, standards and procedures promulgated by the Board on a quarterly basis. The Board shall have the authority to waive this quarterly report and review policy if deemed appropriate by the Board; provided, however, that the Board shall require such reports and conduct such reviews at least once annually. Nothing in this section shall limit the Board's authority to request such reports or to conduct such reviews more frequently than on a quarterly basis if deemed necessary by the Board.

Section Four

The Board shall annually review any contract in existence or proposed involving services to offenders to be provided by any community corrections facility or program established in Adams County and shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County and the Chief Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District of its findings and recommendations as promptly as practicable.

Section Five

The Board shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County regarding the desirability of creating, contracting with, or participating in additional community corrections programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado and shall investigate any proposal for the establishment of a new community corrections facility or program in said county, reporting the Board's findings to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

ARTICLE II

BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Section One

Membership of the Board shall be as established by the Board and reported by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

Section Two

There shall be no fewer than seven (7) and no more than thirteen (13) members of the Board. The Board shall consist of at least one representative from each of the following groups, organizations or entities:

- a. One District Court Judge or County Court Judge from the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- b. One representative from the Office of the District Attorney of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- c. One representative from the Adams County Sheriff's Office.
- d. One parole officer.
- e. One representative from the Office of the Public Defender assigned to the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- f. One representative from the Probation Department of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- g. At least one, and no more than six, representatives to be deemed at large members of the Board and who need not represent any specific constituency.

h. At least one representative from any residential community in which any residential placement facility exits.

Section Three

Each board member shall be entitled to one vote. Each board member may designate an alternate to attend any specific meeting and vote by proxy at said meeting. Such designation must be accomplished prior to the beginning of the meeting in question and may be accomplished either orally or in writing to the Chairperson of the Board.

Section Four

The term of service for each board member shall be three (3) years unless otherwise designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County. Board members who resign or leave the Board for whatever reason shall be replaced as soon as possible. The Chairperson of the Board shall recommend candidates to fill such vacancies on the Board to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County after first having consulted with the remaining members of the Board.

Section Five

Any Board member who misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings without a designated alternate having attended said meetings, shall be subject to removal from the board. Removal shall be by majority vote of those members of the Board attending any meeting at which the matter comes before the Board and at which there is a quorum for conducting business.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section One

There shall be a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of the Board elected as hereinafter provided. The duties of the Chairperson shall be to preside over the meetings of the Board and to call special meetings or poll the Board as the Chairperson deems necessary and proper.

The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the event of the Chairperson's absence or in the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson, the Vice-Chair person shall only fill said vacancy until the Board elects a successor to said position to complete the unexpired term of the vacating Chairperson.

Section Two

The record of minutes of the meetings of the Board and all accounts of the financial matters of the Board shall be kept by the Board's Coordinator who shall be an employee of the County of Adams, State of Colorado and who shall serve as the exofficio Secretary and Treasurer to the Board.

Section Three

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected by the Board from among its membership at the first meeting following the fourth of October of each calendar year to serve for one (1) year.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

Section One

The Board shall hold regular meetings at least once every calendar month. The time and place for said regular meetings shall be determined by the Chairperson and notice thereof shall be given each member of the Board.

The Board may also be called into special session at such times and dates and at such location as the Chairperson shall deem necessary and appropriate.

Section Two

The agenda for each Board meeting shall be presented with the notice of regular meetings whenever feasible and may be amended, if necessary, at the commencement of each such meeting.

Section Three

A quorum necessary for the transaction of business of the Board shall consist of a majority of the members of the Board then serving. The Board may, however, meet and conduct such informal discussions as it pertains to the business of the Board and make such recommendations to a quorum of the Board in the absence of such a quorum and when a quorum of the Board exists, formal action may then be taken on such recommendations. No vote may be taken with respect to such formal action without a quorum of the Board.

Section Four

All Board meetings shall be open to the public unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds majority of the voting members present.

Section Five

The Board is empowered to extend whatever operational funds are provided to it by the Board of County Commissioners for Adams County. All expenditures must be authorized, approved, or ratified by a majority vote of the Board. The Coordinator, acting in the capacity of ex officio Treasurer to the Board, shall maintain the financial records of the Board and be responsible for the maintenance of the budgeted funds and is further empowered to make whatever expenditures the Board may authorize, approve or ratify.

ARTICLE V

BY-LAWS

Section One

These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board then voting, at any regularly scheduled meeting of the Board if notice of the proposed amendment has been given to the members prior to the meeting.

Section Two

These By-Laws shall be in effect upon approval of the Board, with such approval acknowledged by the dated signatures of the Chairperson and ex officio Secretary of the Board.

The Board shall annually review any contract in existence or proposed involving services to offenders to be provided by any community corrections facility or program established in Adams County and shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County and the Chief Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District of its findings and recommendations as promptly as practicable.

Section Five

The Board shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County regarding the desirability of creating, contracting with, or participating in additional community corrections programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado and shall investigate any proposal for the establishment of a new community corrections facility or program in said county, reporting the Board's findings to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

ARTICLE II

BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Section One

Membership of the Board shall be as established by the Board and reported by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

Section Two

There shall be no fewer than seven (7) and no more than thirteen (13) members of the Board. The Board shall consist of at least one representative from each of the following groups, organizations or entities:

- a. One District Court Judge or County Court Judge from the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- b. One representative from the Office of the District Attorney of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- c. One representative from the Adams County Sheriff's Office.
- d. One parole officer.
- e. One representative from the Office of the Public Defender assigned to the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- f. One representative from the Probation Department of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- g. At least one, and no more than six, representatives to be deemed at large members of the Board and who need not represent any specific constituency.

h. At least one representative from any residential community in which any residential placement facility exits.

Section Three

Each board member shall be entitled to one vote. Each board member may designate an alternate to attend any specific meeting and vote by proxy at said meeting. Such designation must be accomplished prior to the beginning of the meeting in question and may be accomplished either orally or in writing to the Chairperson of the Board.

Section Four

The term of service for each board member shall be three (3) years unless otherwise designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County. Board members who resign or leave the Board for whatever reason shall be replaced as soon as possible. The Chairperson of the Board shall recommend candidates to fill such vacancies on the Board to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County after first having consulted with the remaining members of the Board.

Section Five

Any Board member who misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings without a designated alternate having attended said meetings, shall be subject to removal from the board. Removal shall be by majority vote of those members of the Board attending any meeting at which the matter comes before the Board and at which there is a quorum for conducting business.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section One

There shall be a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of the Board elected as hereinafter provided. The duties of the Chairperson shall be to preside over the meetings of the Board and to call special meetings or poll the Board as the Chairperson deems necessary and proper.

The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the event of the Chairperson's absence or in the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson, the Vice-Chair person shall only fill said vacancy until the Board elects a successor to said position to complete the unexpired term of the vacating Chairperson.

Section Two

The record of minutes of the meetings of the Board and all accounts of the financial matters of the Board shall be kept by the Board's Coordinator who shall be an employee of the County of Adams, State of Colorado and who shall serve as the exofficio Secretary and Treasurer to the Board.

Section Three

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected by the Board from among its membership at the first meeting following the fourth of October of each calendar year to serve for one (1) year.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

Section One

The Board shall hold regular meetings at least once every calendar month. The time and place for said regular meetings shall be determined by the Chairperson and notice thereof shall be given each member of the Board.

The Board may also be called into special session at such times and dates and at such location as the Chairperson shall deem necessary and appropriate.

Section Two

The agenda for each Board meeting shall be presented with the notice of regular meetings whenever feasible and may be amended, if necessary, at the commencement of each such meeting.

Section Three

A quorum necessary for the transaction of business of the Board shall consist of a majority of the members of the Board then serving. The Board may, however, meet and conduct such informal discussions as it pertains to the business of the Board and make such recommendations to a quorum of the Board in the absence of such a quorum and when a quorum of the Board exists, formal action may then be taken on such recommendations. No vote may be taken with respect to such formal action without a quorum of the Board.

Section Four

All Board meetings shall be open to the public unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds majority of the voting members present.

Section Five

The Board is empowered to extend whatever operational funds are provided to it by the Board of County Commissioners for Adams County. All expenditures must be authorized, approved, or ratified by a majority vote of the Board. The Coordinator, acting in the capacity of ex officio Treasurer to the Board, shall maintain the financial records of the Board and be responsible for the maintenance of the budgeted funds and is further empowered to make whatever expenditures the Board may authorize, approve or ratify.

ARTICLE V

BY-LAWS

Section One

These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board then voting, at any regularly scheduled meeting of the Board if notice of the proposed amendment has been given to the members prior to the meeting.

Section Two

These By-Laws shall be in effect upon approval of the Board, with such approval acknowledged by the dated signatures of the Chairperson and ex officio Secretary of the Board.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND PROCEEDINGS

Section One

The Adams County Community Corrections Board, hereinafter referred to as "The Board", has been established pursuant to the authority of §17-27-103 (2), C.R.S., as amended, to oversee all community corrections facilities and programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, including community services programs, and to advise the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado on matters relating to community corrections facilities and programs and such other related issues as may be referred to it by the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

Section Two

The Board shall promulgate such policies, standards and procedures for the conduct of community corrections facilities and programs in Addams County as it deems appropriate. Such promulgation shall be by a vote of the majority of those members of the board attending any meeting of the Board where a quorum has been declared.

Section Three

The Board shall require the submission of budgetary and operational reports from all community corrections facilities and programs, including community services programs, on a quarterly basis and shall review such reports along with all policies, standards and procedures promulgated by the Board on a quarterly basis. The Board shall have the authority to waive this quarterly report and review policy if deemed appropriate by the Board; provided, however, that the Board shall require such reports and conduct such reviews at least once annually. Nothing in this section shall limit the Board's authority to request such reports or to conduct such reviews more frequently than on a quarterly basis if deemed necessary by the Board.

Section Four

The Board shall annually review any contract in existence or proposed involving services to offenders to be provided by any community corrections facility or program established in Adams County and shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County and the Chief Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District of its findings and recommendations as promptly as practicable.

Section Five

The Board shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County regarding the desirability of creating, contracting with, or participating in additional community corrections programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado and shall investigate any proposal for the establishment of a new community corrections facility or program in said county, reporting the Board's findings to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

ARTICLE II

BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Section One

Membership of the Board shall be as established by the Board and reported by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

Section Two

There shall be no fewer than seven (7) and no more than thirteen (13) members of the Board. The Board shall consist of at least one representative from each of the following groups, organizations or entities:

- a. One District Court Judge or County Court Judge from the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- b. One representative from the Office of the District Attorney of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- c. One representative from the Adams County Sheriff's Office.
- d. One parole officer.
- e. One representative from the Office of the Public Defender assigned to the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- f. One representative from the Probation Department of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- g. At least one, and no more than six, representatives to be deemed at large members of the Board and who need not represent any specific constituency.

h. At least one representative from any residential community in which any residential placement facility exits.

Section Three

Each board member shall be entitled to one vote. Each board member may designate an alternate to attend any specific meeting and vote by proxy at said meeting. Such designation must be accomplished prior to the beginning of the meeting in question and may be accomplished either orally or in writing to the Chairperson of the Board.

Section Four

The term of service for each board member shall be three (3) years unless otherwise designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County. Board members who resign or leave the Board for whatever reason shall be replaced as soon as possible. The Chairperson of the Board shall recommend candidates to fill such vacancies on the Board to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County after first having consulted with the remaining members of the Board.

Section Five

Any Board member who misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings without a designated alternate having attended said meetings, shall be subject to removal from the board. Removal shall be by majority vote of those members of the Board attending any meeting at which the matter comes before the Board and at which there is a quorum for conducting business.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

Section One

There shall be a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of the Board elected as hereinafter provided. The duties of the Chairperson shall be to preside over the meetings of the Board and to call special meetings or poll the Board as the Chairperson deems necessary and proper.

The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the event of the Chairperson's absence or in the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson, the Vice-Chair person shall only fill said vacancy until the Board elects a successor to said position to complete the unexpired term of the vacating Chairperson.

Section Two

The record of minutes of the meetings of the Board and all accounts of the financial matters of the Board shall be kept by the Board's Coordinator who shall be an employee of the County of Adams, State of Colorado and who shall serve as the exofficio Secretary and Treasurer to the Board.

Section Three

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected by the Board from among its membership at the first meeting following the fourth of October of each calendar year to serve for one (1) year.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

Section One

The Board shall hold regular meetings at least once every calendar month. The time and place for said regular meetings shall be determined by the Chairperson and notice thereof shall be given each member of the Board.

The Board may also be called into special session at such times and dates and at such location as the Chairperson shall deem necessary and appropriate.

Section Two

The agenda for each Board meeting shall be presented with the notice of regular meetings whenever feasible and may be amended, if necessary, at the commencement of each such meeting.

Section Three

A quorum necessary for the transaction of business of the Board shall consist of a majority of the members of the Board then serving. The Board may, however, meet and conduct such informal discussions as it pertains to the business of the Board and make such recommendations to a quorum of the Board in the absence of such a quorum and when a quorum of the Board exists, formal action may then be taken on such recommendations. No vote may be taken with respect to such formal action without a quorum of the Board.

Section Four

All Board meetings shall be open to the public unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds majority of the voting members present.

Section Five

The Board is empowered to extend whatever operational funds are provided to it by the Board of County Commissioners for Adams County. All expenditures must be authorized, approved, or ratified by a majority vote of the Board. The Coordinator, acting in the capacity of ex officio Treasurer to the Board, shall maintain the financial records of the Board and be responsible for the maintenance of the budgeted funds and is further empowered to make whatever expenditures the Board may authorize, approve or ratify.

ARTICLE V

BY-LAWS

Section One

These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board then voting, at any regularly scheduled meeting of the Board if notice of the proposed amendment has been given to the members prior to the meeting.

Section Two

These By-Laws shall be in effect upon approval of the Board, with such approval acknowledged by the dated signatures of the Chairperson and ex officio Secretary of the Board.

WHERAS, the Adams County Board of County Commissioners initially established the Adams County Community Corrections Board by resolution on October 4, 1982; and

WHEREAS, the statutory framework supporting the establishment and operations of community corrections boards has since been amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 17-27-103(1), C.R.S., provides that counties may establish a community corrections board; and

WHEREAS, Section 17-27-103(1), C.R.S., provides that a community corrections board may establish community corrections programs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners intends to continue the Adams County Community Corrections Board with its powers to oversee all community corrections facilities and programs in Adams County and to advise the Board of County Commissioners on community corrections facilities and programs and other such issues as may be referred to it by the Board;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Adams County Community Corrections Board is hereby continued. It is to be comprised of at least seven and not more than eleven persons, to include at least one member who is a District or County Court Judge, one member from the District Attorney's Office, one member from the Sheriff's Office, one parole officer, one member from the Public Defender's Office, one member from the Adams County Probation Department, and other such member as the Board of County Commissioners may appoint. Terms of membership shall be three years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Community Corrections Board shall continue to have the following powers:

- 1. To establish and enforce standards and policies for the operation of Adams County community corrections facilities and programs;
- 2. To advise the Board of County Commissioners on community corrections business and related issues, excluding the Adams County Detention Center;

- 3. To advise the Board of County Commissioners on the existence of and the desirability of creating, contracting with, or participating in additional community corrections programs;
- 4. To advise the Board of County Commissioners on such other related issues as the Board of County Commissioners may refer to it; and,
- 5. To establish its own by-laws and procedures not inconsistent with the powers set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the Community Corrections Board, when acting in their official capacities and within the course and scope of their duties as members of the Community Corrections Board, shall be considered employees of Adams County for the purposes of the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, Section 24-10-101, et seq., C.R.S.

ADAMS COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND PROCEEDINGS

Section One

The Adams County Community Corrections Board, hereinafter referred to as "The Board", has been established pursuant to the authority of §17-27-103 (2), C.R.S., as amended, to oversee all community corrections facilities and programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, including community services programs, and to advise the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado on matters relating to community corrections facilities and programs and such other related issues as may be referred to it by the Board of County Commissioners for the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

Section Two

The Board shall promulgate such policies, standards and procedures for the conduct of community corrections facilities and programs in Addams County as it deems appropriate. Such promulgation shall be by a vote of the majority of those members of the board attending any meeting of the Board where a quorum has been declared.

Section Three

The Board shall require the submission of budgetary and operational reports from all community corrections facilities and programs, including community services programs, on a quarterly basis and shall review such reports along with all policies, standards and procedures promulgated by the Board on a quarterly basis. The Board shall have the authority to waive this quarterly report and review policy if deemed appropriate by the Board; provided, however, that the Board shall require such reports and conduct such reviews at least once annually. Nothing in this section shall limit the Board's authority to request such reports or to conduct such reviews more frequently than on a quarterly basis if deemed necessary by the Board.

Section Four

The Board shall annually review any contract in existence or proposed involving services to offenders to be provided by any community corrections facility or program established in Adams County and shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County and the Chief Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District of its findings and recommendations as promptly as practicable.

Section Five

The Board shall advise the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County regarding the desirability of creating, contracting with, or participating in additional community corrections programs in the County of Adams, State of Colorado and shall investigate any proposal for the establishment of a new community corrections facility or program in said county, reporting the Board's findings to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

ARTICLE II

BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Section One

Membership of the Board shall be as established by the Board and reported by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County.

Section Two

There shall be no fewer than seven (7) and no more than thirteen (13) members of the Board. The Board shall consist of at least one representative from each of the following groups, organizations or entities:

- a. One District Court Judge or County Court Judge from the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- b. One representative from the Office of the District Attorney of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- c. One representative from the Adams County Sheriff's Office.
- d. One parole officer.
- e. One representative from the Office of the Public Defender assigned to the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- f. One representative from the Probation Department of the Seventeenth Judicial District.
- g. At least one, and no more than six, representatives to be deemed at large members of the Board and who need not represent any specific constituency.

h. At least one representative from any residential community in which any residential placement facility exits.

Section Three

Each board member shall be entitled to one vote. Each board member may designate an alternate to attend any specific meeting and vote by proxy at said meeting. Such designation must be accomplished prior to the beginning of the meeting in question and may be accomplished either orally or in writing to the Chairperson of the Board.

Section Four

The term of service for each board member shall be three (3) years unless otherwise designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County. Board members who resign or leave the Board for whatever reason shall be replaced as soon as possible. The Chairperson of the Board shall recommend candidates to fill such vacancies on the Board to the Board of County Commissioners of Adams County after first having consulted with the remaining members of the Board.

Section Five

Any Board member who misses three (3) consecutive Board meetings without a designated alternate having attended said meetings, shall be subject to removal from the board. Removal shall be by majority vote of those members of the Board attending any meeting at which the matter comes before the Board and at which there is a quorum for conducting business.

ARTICLE III

<u>OFFICERS</u>

Section One

There shall be a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of the Board elected as hereinafter provided. The duties of the Chairperson shall be to preside over the meetings of the Board and to call special meetings or poll the Board as the Chairperson deems necessary and proper.

The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the event of the Chairperson's absence or in the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Chairperson, the Vice-Chair person shall only fill said vacancy until the Board elects a successor to said position to complete the unexpired term of the vacating Chairperson.

Section Two

The record of minutes of the meetings of the Board and all accounts of the financial matters of the Board shall be kept by the Board's Coordinator who shall be an employee of the County of Adams, State of Colorado and who shall serve as the exofficio Secretary and Treasurer to the Board.

Section Three

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected by the Board from among its membership at the first meeting following the fourth of October of each calendar year to serve for one (1) year.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

Section One

The Board shall hold regular meetings at least once every calendar month. The time and place for said regular meetings shall be determined by the Chairperson and notice thereof shall be given each member of the Board.

The Board may also be called into special session at such times and dates and at such location as the Chairperson shall deem necessary and appropriate.

Section Two

The agenda for each Board meeting shall be presented with the notice of regular meetings whenever feasible and may be amended, if necessary, at the commencement of each such meeting.

Section Three

A quorum necessary for the transaction of business of the Board shall consist of a majority of the members of the Board then serving. The Board may, however, meet and conduct such informal discussions as it pertains to the business of the Board and make such recommendations to a quorum of the Board in the absence of such a quorum and when a quorum of the Board exists, formal action may then be taken on such recommendations. No vote may be taken with respect to such formal action without a quorum of the Board.

Section Four

All Board meetings shall be open to the public unless otherwise determined by a two-thirds majority of the voting members present.

Section Five

The Board is empowered to extend whatever operational funds are provided to it by the Board of County Commissioners for Adams County. All expenditures must be authorized, approved, or ratified by a majority vote of the Board. The Coordinator, acting in the capacity of ex officio Treasurer to the Board, shall maintain the financial records of the Board and be responsible for the maintenance of the budgeted funds and is further empowered to make whatever expenditures the Board may authorize, approve or ratify.

ARTICLE V

BY-LAWS

Section One

These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Board then voting, at any regularly scheduled meeting of the Board if notice of the proposed amendment has been given to the members prior to the meeting.

Section Two

These By-Laws shall be in effect upon approval of the Board, with such approval acknowledged by the dated signatures of the Chairperson and ex officio Secretary of the Board.

BACKGROUND:

The Midtown Subdivision Fil. No. 1 is generally located at 67th Ave. and Pecos St. in unincorporated Adams County as indicated by the attached map (Exhibit A). The private drainage improvements referred to herein are located along the east side of Pecos St. at approximately this same location. These private drainage improvements have been completed in general conformance with the construction plans and have satisfactorily completed the warranty period. Bond Number TM5134293 for \$393,793.75 was previously reduced to \$39,379.38 by Surety Rider to cover the requested reduction in collateral, as allowed in the Subdivision Improvements Agreement, approved by resolution, dated March 15, 2016. Per the Subdivision Improvements Agreement approved by the aforementioned resolution, the Clear Creek Station Metropolitan Districts No. 2 and No. 3, (CCSMD, collectively, the Districts) will be solely responsible for the maintenance of these drainage improvements into perpetuity, and Adams County has no further obligation in this matter, other than to release the previously mentioned bond.

BACKGROUND:

Discovery DJ Services (Discovery) requests that Adams County approve a Right-of-Way Agreement and Memorandum of Right-of-Way Agreement for an easement to construct a 12.75 inch pipeline for transmission of natural gas and natural gas condensate across Adams County owned property north of East 120th Avenue between Gun Club Road and Harvest Road (Sheriff's Flatrock Facility). Discovery requests a permanent easement, 30 feet in width and approximately 1/2 mile in length and an associated temporary construction easement of an additional 25' in width and of the same length. This pipeline is a portion of an approximately 18 mile long underground pipeline for which Discovery has made application for a Conditional Use Permit with a Development Agreement (Case No. RCU2016-00016, Case Name: Boardwalk Pipeline Project dated December 13, 2016). The attached Right-of-Way Agreement has been negotiated for the granting of these easements under mutually agreed upon conditions to protect the County's infrastructure. The attached Right-of-Way Agreement and Memorandum of Right-of-Way Agreement will allow Discovery the installation and maintenance of the transmission line on County property.

WHEREAS, Adams County owns property (the "Property") north of East 120th Avenue between the Gun Club Road and the Harvest Road being in the Southwest Quarter of Section 31, Township 1 South, Range 65 West of the 6th Principal Meridian, Adams County, Colorado; and,

WHEREAS, the Property is being used for various purposes by the Adams County Sheriff's Department; and,

WHEREAS, Discovery DJ Services, LLC a Texas Limited Liability Company ("Discovery") desires to construct approximately 18 miles of underground 12.75 inch steel pipeline and appurtenances to transport natural gas and natural gas condensate in Adams County (as more particularly described in that certain Conditional Use Permit Application Case # RCU2016-00016, Case Name: Boardwalk Pipeline Project dated December 13, 2016); and,

WHEREAS, Discovery has requested permanent and temporary easements in the form of a Right-of-Way Agreement over a portion of the Property for a portion of this pipeline approximately one-half mile in length; and,

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions of the Right-of-Way Agreement and Memorandum of Right-of-Way Agreement, the approval and granting of said Right-of-Way Agreement and Memorandum of Right-of-Way Agreement will not adversely affect the use of the Property for Adams County Sheriff's Office purposes; and,

WHEREAS, this location will allow transmission of petroleum products between Discovery facilities without encroaching into the Adams County Road right-of-way except for occasional near right angle crossings thereof.

In consideration of the sum of Twenty-one Thousand Three Hundred Twenty and no/100 Dollars (\$21,320.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by Grantor, Grantor does hereby grant, warrant, convey and assign unto Discovery, its successors and assigns, a perpetual and exclusive easement and right of way for the locating of the routes for, and the laying, constructing, erecting, operating, maintaining, inspecting, testing, repairing, changing the size of, relocating, relaying, removing and/or abandoning in place a pipeline or pipelines, and appurtenances, along with right of ingress, egress, and regress, together with such valves, fittings, meters, connections, markers, cathodic protection, corrosion control and monitoring devices, pipeline operating control devices, hydrate removal systems, communications, telemetry and data acquisition facilities and related facilities, overhead and/or underground electric lines, regulators and other above and below ground appurtenances, and other equipment and appurtenances (collectively, "the Facilities") as may be necessary or convenient for the transportation by pipeline of oil, gas, condensate, natural gas liquids petroleum or any products, byproducts thereof, water, other liquids and gases and mixtures of any of the foregoing, including on, over, under, across and through a strip of land thirty feet in width (the "Right of Way"), further depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof, and located all or in part of:

A portion of the Southwest Quarter (SW1/4) of Section 31, Township 1 South, Range 65 West of the 6th Principal Meridian, County of Adams, State of Colorado, being more particularly described in that certain Special Warranty Deed dated May 1, 2008 between SCM-GRP Van Schaak, LLLP, et al as Grantor and County of Adams as Grantee, recorded at Reception No. 2008000035998 of the Real Estate Records, Adams County, Colorado.

This Agreement is made subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Discovery agrees to bury any permanent pipelines used for the transportation and gathering of oil, gas, other hydrocarbons and their constituents so that the top of said pipelines will be buried at least forty-eight inches below the existing ground level contour at the time of initial construction. In areas of rock concentration, such pipelines will be buried so that the top of said pipelines will be buried at least thirty-six inches below the existing ground level contour.
- 2. Discovery will reseed any areas disturbed by Discovery's operations on the Right of Way with a seasonal perennial or with suitable alternatives, as determined in Discovery's reasonable discretion. This clause will not apply to tillable farmland.
- 3. Discovery will restore the disturbed areas to as near as practicable the condition which existed on the date of commencement of construction activities on the Right of Way.
- 4. Discovery shall level and restore any lands affected by Discovery's operations that may

have excessive settling and sufficiently compact and re-vegetate the soil within a reasonable period of time being not less than (2 years) afer completion of construction to the condition that existed at the time immediately prior to the placement of Discovery's pipeline, to the extent reasonably practicable.

- 5. If Discovery temporarily removes a gate, fence, or a portion of a fence in the Right of Way area in connection with its pipeline installation or maintenance operations, Discovery agrees to replace said gate, fence, or portion of fence with that of a like kind and quality upon completion of its pipeline installation or maintenance operations.
- 6. Grantor hereby grants to Discovery and its successor and assigns the right of ingress and egress to and from the Right of Way for any and all purposes necessary or convenient, including but not limited to geotechnical, cultural, and environmental surveys, related to the exercise by Discovery of the rights granted in this Agreement on, over and across the Right of Way and any adjacent property owned by Grantor.
- 7. Grantor hereby grants to Discovery and its successors and assigns the right to use a strip of land fifty feet in width as a temporary workspace easement to be located along, adjacent to and parallel with the Right of Way. Grantor hereby also grants to Discovery and its successors and assigns the right to use additional workspace at the crossing of existing easements, roads, railroads, streams, canals or uneven terrain alongside the Right of Way as needed during the exercise of any of the rights granted in this Agreement and will have the right at any time to clear and keep clear the Right of Way of any trees, shrubs, or brush without payment for damages.
- 8. Grantor will not construct or erect any temporary or permanent buildings, structures or other obstructions or improvements in, on or under the Right of Way, and will not change the depth of the cover over any of Discovery's Facilities (collectively, "Encroachments"). Discovery will have the right to remove any and all such Encroachments. Grantor further agrees not to convey any other rights of way or other conflicting rights within the Right of Way to any third parties, without the prior written consent of Discovery.
- 9. Discovery agrees to comply with any applicable federal and state regulations, orders and rules related to the Facilities and the exercise of Discovery's rights hereunder.
- 10. Discovery agrees to protect, indemnify, and hold harmless Grantor from any claims, demands, expenses, losses, damages, or injuries (including death) to persons or property to the extent caused by Discovery's negligence or the negligence of Discovery's employees, and/or authorized agents, affiliates, or any other third party working on behalf of Discovery (collectively, "Discovery's Representatives") in connection with Discovery's or Discovery's Representatives' use of the Facilities and/or Right of Way; provided, however, Discovery will not be liable for, and is hereby released from, any and all claims, damages, losses, judgments, suits, actions and liabilities, whether arising during, prior to or subsequent to the term of this Agreement, related to the presence of pollutants, contaminants, petroleum, hazardous substances, or endangerments in, beneath, or along the adjacent property and/or the Right of Way except to the extent caused by the acts or omissions of Discovery or Discovery's Representatives.
- 11. Grantor agrees to cooperate with Discovery, at no expense to Grantor, and without any additional consideration from Discovery, to execute, acknowledge, and deliver to Discovery, its successors and assigns, such instruments as are reasonably useful or necessary for Discovery to exercise its rights under this Agreement, including but not

limited to curative title documents, and such documents as are reasonably useful or necessary to correct a description and evidence such correction in the appropriate amendments, and documents pertaining to related permits.

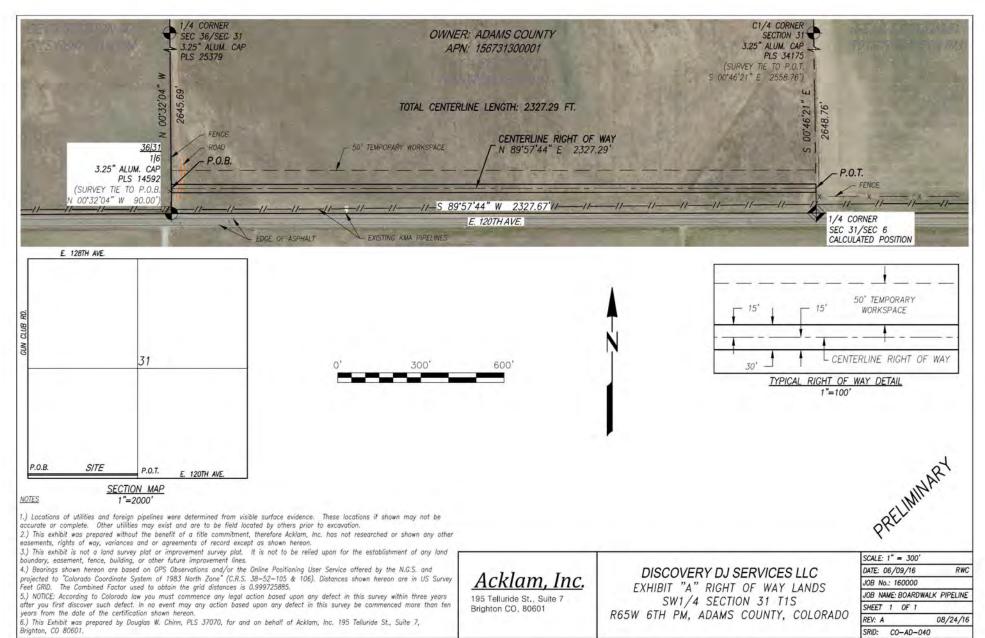
- 12. Discovery shall have the right to discharge or redeem for Grantor, in whole or in part, any mortgage, tax or other lien that covers, in whole or in part the Right-of-Way and shall be subrogated to such lien and rights.
- 13. This Agreement and privileges granted in this Agreement are divisible, assignable and transferable in whole or in part by Discovery. This Agreement can be signed in counterparts with the same effect as if both Grantor and Discovery signed one agreement. Should the entities or persons that comprise Grantor be more than one in number at any given time, each such entity or person will receive any payment provided under this Agreement in such proportion as their respective interest bears to the entire fee simple title of the Right of Way.
- 15. If any provision or any portion of any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable by reason of any law or public policy, such provision or portion thereof will be considered to be deleted, and the remainder of this Agreement will constitute the agreement between Grantor and Discovery covering the subject matter hereof.
- 16. Grantor and Discovery intend and agree that the Right of Way and the rights granted in this Agreement are and will be a covenant running with the land and will be binding on and inure to the benefit of Grantor, Discovery and their successors, heirs and assigns.
- 17. Grantor and Discovery acknowledge and agree that this Agreement contains and expresses all the agreements and obligations of Grantor and Discovery with respect to the rights granted in this Agreement and no covenant, agreement, or obligation not expressed in this Agreement shall be imposed upon Grantor or Discovery, their heirs, successors and assigns, unless in writing and executed by both Grantor or Discovery. A Memorandum will be executed, in recordable form, by both Grantor and Discovery and recorded by Discovery (at Discovery's sole cost) with the <u>Adams County Recorder</u>. Said Memorandum will describe the parties, the Property, the Right of Way and will incorporate this Agreement by reference, but will not disclose the consideration or other terms of this Agreement other than those stated in this sentence.

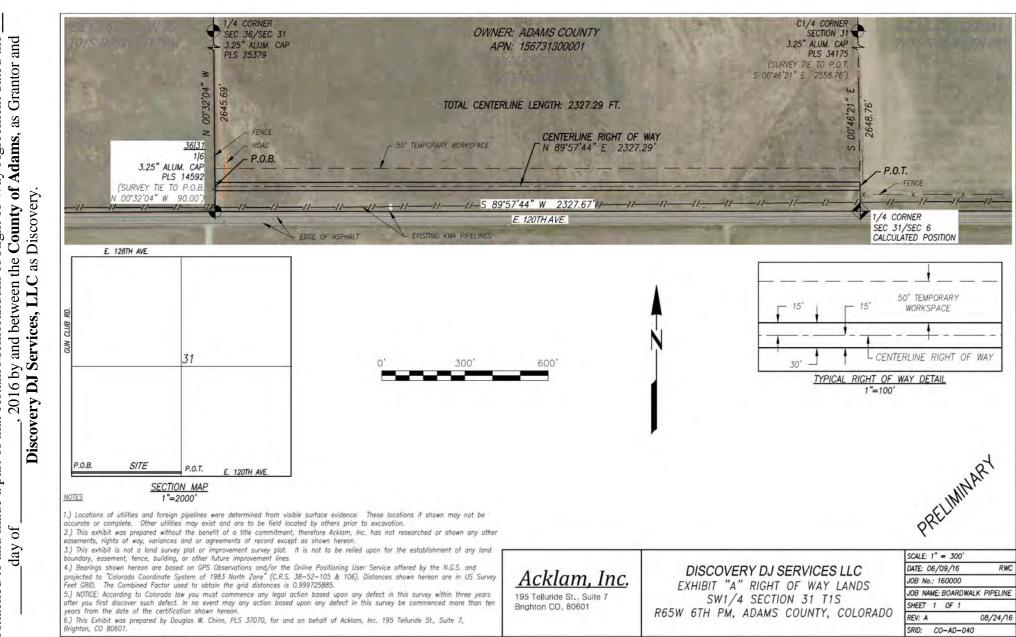

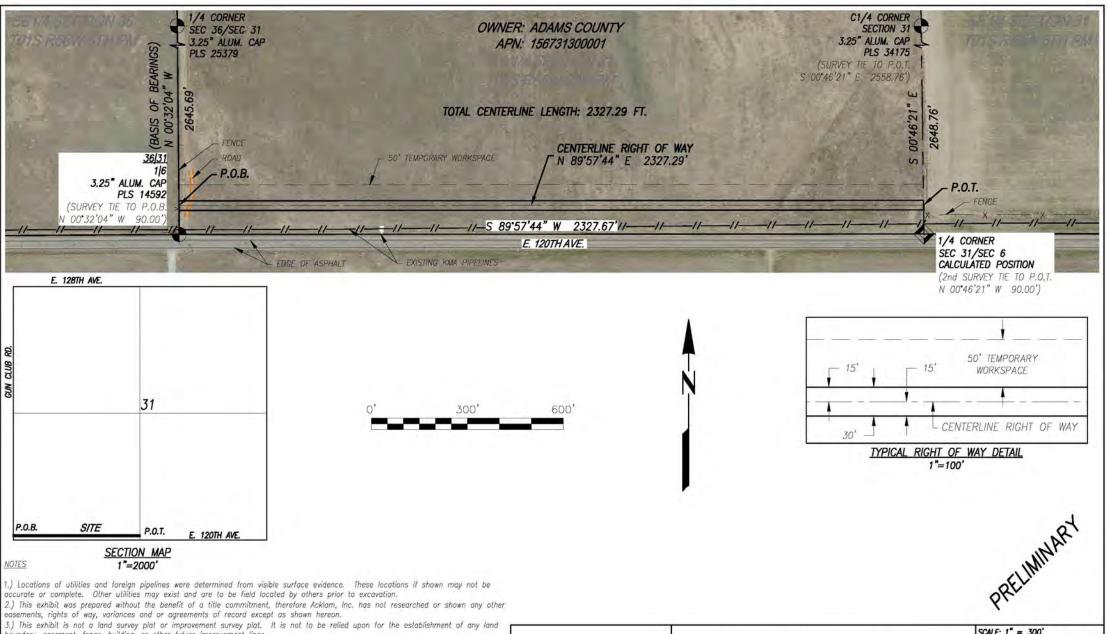

AGREEMENT BETWEEN ADAMS COUNTY AND ADAMS COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INC. FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this _____ day of ______, 2017, by and between Adams County Board of County Commissioners, located at 4430 South Adams County Parkway, Brighton, Colorado 80601, hereinafter referred to as the "the County," and Adams County Economic Development, located 12200 Pecos Street, Suite 100, Westminster, CO 80234, hereinafter referred to as "ACED". The County and ACED may be collectively referred to herein as the "Parties".

The County and ACED for the consideration herein set forth, agree as follows:

1. SERVICES OF ACED

- 1.1 ACED shall provide primary employer support and expansion services to strengthen economic development on a countywide basis for the County of Adams. The services provided by ACED shall include the following:
- 1.2 Creating and submitting to the Board of County Commissioners for its approval an annual work plan for achieving the scope of service and providing quarterly updates

 - 1.3.2 Business retention visit outcomes- new job and capital investment figures
 - 1.3.3 Primary employer attraction efforts
 - 1.3.4 Marketing activities
 - 1.3.5 Adams County commercial real estate activity
 - 1.3.6 Financial incentives update including current year payments and projected future year payments
 - 1.3.7 Status update on progress made on achieving annual work plan.
- 1.4 ACED shall enhance the economic strength of the County by recruiting new primary employers, retaining existing primary employers and assisting current primary employers to expand in the County.
- 1.5 ACED shall exert targeted efforts to attract and retain primary jobs in targeted industries identified by ACED, including but not limited to advanced manufacturing, life and biosciences, energy, aviation and aerospace, capital intensive businesses, and corporate office users.
- 1.6 ACED shall market the County as a desirable business location to prospective businesses and industries in the region, throughout the nation and the world and shall maintain a current list of potential business prospects.

- 1.7 ACED shall provide any and all necessary community data information including current land and building opportunities to any Adams County business prospect or client to encourage it to locate in the County.
- 1.8 ACED shall conduct a minimum of 100 business retention visits per year and shall report the summary results of those visits in the Quarterly Economic Development Report to the Board of County Commissioners.
- 1.9 ACED shall negotiate incentives with qualifying primary businesses on behalf of Adams County, make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners on incentive agreements, and shall submit documentation and justification for said incentives to the County for approval. ACED shall certify business activity and eligibility for incentive payments, and submit documentation and justification to the County prior to payment of incentives.
- 1.10 ACED shall provide the County with financial and performance measurement reports on a quarterly basis regarding its activities and metrics.
- 1.11 Prior to the issuance of the first quarterly payment set forth in Article 4, ACED shall brief the Commissioners and receive their approval of the annual work plan for achieving the scope of services. Prior to the issuance of the second, third and fourth quarterly payments, ACED shall meet with the Board of County Commissioners to review its progress on the work plan.
- **2** .RESPONSIBILITES OF THE COUNTY The County shall provide ACED with information as necessary or requested by ACED to enable ACED's performance under this agreement. The Deputy Director of Community & Economic Development at the County shall serve as the primary liaison to ACED.

<u>3.TERM</u>

3.1 <u>Term of Agreement:</u> The services to be performed by ACED under this agreement shall be commenced on the 1st day of January 2017 and shall be terminated on the 31st day of December 2017, inclusive, unless previously terminated by either pursuant to the provisions of Section 9.

4. PAYMENT AND FEE SCHEDULE

4.1 <u>Payment and Fee Schedule</u>: The County shall pay ACED a total of Five Hundred Twenty Six Thousand and Sixty Four Dollars (\$526,064). Payments shall be made on a quarterly basis. The following installment schedule is contingent upon on the performance of the scope of services set forth in Section 1.

- 4.3 The consideration set forth in Paragraph 1, above, shall constitute the total consideration paid by the County to ACED for services provided and the expenditures incurred by ACED in the performance of this Agreement.
- 4.4 If at any time this Agreement is terminated by either party pursuant to the provisions of Article 9 hereof, the pro-rata portion of the advance payment and any monies not used in the direct furtherance of the purposes of this Agreement shall be returned to the County within (10) days of said termination and the County's responsibility for further payments hereunder is terminated.
- 4.5 ACED acknowledges and agrees that any monies not encumbered or benefits not used in the direct furtherance of the purposes of this Agreement at the end of the term set forth shall no longer be available to ACED except by further written agreement. Unless a subsequent agreement with the County is reached, any County funds not used in the furtherance of this Agreement shall be returned to the County on or before sixty (60) days after the expiration of this Agreement.
- 5. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR In providing services under this Agreement, ACED acts as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the County. ACED shall be solely and entirely responsible for his/her acts and the acts of his/her employees, agents, servants, and subcontractors during the term and performance of this Agreement. No employee, agent, servant, or subcontractor of ACED shall be deemed to be an employee, agent, or servant of the County because of the performance of any services or work under this Agreement. The Contractor, at its expense, shall procure and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by law. Pursuant to the Workers' Compensation Act § 8-40-202(2)(b)(IV), C.R.S., as amended, ACED understands that it and its employees and servants are not entitled to workers' compensation benefits from the County. ACED further understands that it is solely obligated for the payment of federal and state income tax on any moneys earned pursuant to this Agreement.

6. NONDISCRIMINATION:

6.1 ACED shall not discriminate against any employee or qualified applicant for employment because of age, race, color, religion, marital status, disability, sex, or national origin. ACED agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices provided by the local public agency setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause. Adams County is an equal opportunity employer.

- 6.1.1 ACED will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by this Agreement so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- **7. INDEMNIFICATION:** ACED agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents, and employees for, from, and against any and all claims, suits, expenses, damages, or other liabilities, including reasonable attorney fees and court costs, arising out of damage or injury to persons, entities, or property, caused or sustained by any person(s) as a result of the ACED's performance or failure to perform pursuant to the terms of this Agreement or as a result of any subcontractors' performance or failure to perform pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
- **8. INSURANCE:** ACED agrees to maintain insurance of the following types and amounts:
 - <u>8.1 Commercial General Liability Insurance:</u> to include products liability, completed operations, contractual, broad form property damage and personal injury.

i. Each Occurrence: \$1,000,000ii. General Aggregate: \$2,000,000

<u>8.2 Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance:</u> to include all motor vehicles owned, hired, leased, or borrowed.

8.2.1 Bodily Injury/Property Damage: \$1,000,000 (each accident)
8.2.2 Personal Injury Protection: Per Colorado Statutes

- <u>8.3 Workers' Compensation Insurance:</u> Per Colorado Statutes
- <u>8.4 Professional Liability Insurance</u>: to include coverage for damages or claims for damages arising out of the rendering, or failure to render, any professional services, as applicable.

<u>8.4.1</u> Each Occurrence: \$1,000,000

- 8.4.2 This insurance requirement applies only to the Contractors who are performing services under this Agreement as professionals licensed under the laws of the State of Colorado, such as physicians, lawyers, engineers, nurses, mental health providers, and any other licensed professionals.
- 8.5 Adams County as "Additional Insured": The Contractor's commercial general liability, comprehensive automobile liability, and professional liability insurance policies and/or certificates of insurance shall be issued to include Adams County as an "additional

insured" and shall include the following provisions:

- 8.5.1 Underwriters shall have no right of recovery or subrogation against the County, it being the intent of the parties that the insurance policies so affected shall protect both parties and be primary coverage for any and all losses resulting from the actions or negligence of the Contractor.
- 8.5.2 The insurance companies issuing the policy or policies shall have no recourse against the County for payment of any premiums due or for any assessments under any form of any policy.
- 8.5.3 Any and all deductibles contained in any insurance policy shall be assumed by and at the sole risk of the Contractor.
- 8.6 <u>Licensed Insurers</u>: All insurers of ACED must be licensed or approved to do business in the State of Colorado. Upon failure of ACED to furnish, deliver and/or maintain such insurance as provided herein, this Agreement, at the election of the County, may be immediately declared suspended, discontinued, or terminated. Failure of ACED in obtaining and/or maintaining any required insurance shall not relieve ACED from any liability under this Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with the obligations of ACED concerning indemnification.
- <u>8.7 Endorsement:</u> Each insurance policy herein required shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, or canceled without thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the County.
- <u>8.8 Proof of Insurance:</u> At any time during the term of this Agreement, the County may require ACED to provide proof of the insurance coverage or policies required under this Agreement.

9 TERMINATION:

- 9.1 For Cause: If, through any cause, ACED fails to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement in a timely and proper manner, or if ACED violates any of the covenants, conditions, or stipulations of this Agreement, the County shall thereupon have the right to immediately terminate this Agreement, upon giving written notice to ACED of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof.
- 9.2 For Convenience: The County may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving written notice as specified herein to the other party, which notice shall be given at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the termination. If this Agreement is terminated by the County, ACED will be paid an amount that bears the same ratio to the total compensation as the services actually performed bear to the total services ACED was to perform under this Agreement, less payments previously made to ACED under this Agreement.

10 MUTUAL UNDERSTANDINGS:

10.1 <u>Jurisdiction and Venue:</u> The laws of the State of Colorado shall govern as to the interpretation, validity, and effect of this Agreement. The parties agree that jurisdiction

- and venue for any disputes arising under this Agreement shall be with Adams County, Colorado.
- 10.2 Compliance with Laws: During the performance of this Agreement, ACED agrees to strictly adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations, including all licensing and permit requirements. The parties hereto aver that they are familiar with § 18-8-301, et seq., C.R.S. (Bribery and Corrupt Influences), as amended, and § 18-8-401, et seq., C.R.S. (Abuse of Public Office), as amended, and that no violation of such provisions are present. ACED warrants that it is in compliance with the residency requirements in §§ 8-17.5-101, et seq., C.R.S. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, ACED expressly agrees to comply with the privacy and security requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).
- 10.3 OSHA: ACED shall comply with the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) and shall review and comply with the County's safety regulations while on any County property. Failure to comply with any applicable federal, state or local law, rule, or regulation shall give the County the right to terminate this agreement for cause.
- 10.4 Record Retention: ACED shall maintain records and documentation of the services provided under this Agreement, including fiscal records, and shall retain the records for a period of three (3) years from the date this Agreement is terminated. Said records and documents shall be subject at all reasonable times to inspection, review, or audit by authorized Federal, State, or County personnel.
- 10.5 <u>Assign Ability:</u> Neither this Agreement, nor any rights hereunder, in whole or in part, shall be assignable or otherwise transferable by ACED without the prior written consent of the County.
- 10.6 <u>Waiver</u>: Waiver of strict performance or the breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver, nor shall it prejudice the waiving party's right to require strict performance of the same provision, or any other provision in the future, unless such waiver has rendered future performance commercially impossible.
- 10.7 Force Majeure: Neither party shall be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations hereunder to the extent that such delay or failure is caused by a force or event beyond the control of such party including, without limitation, war, embargoes, strikes, governmental restrictions, riots, fires, floods, earthquakes, or other acts of God.
- 10.8 Notice: Any notices given under this Agreement are deemed to have been received and to be effective: 1) Three (3) days after the same shall have been mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested; 2) Immediately upon hand delivery; or 3) Immediately upon receipt of confirmation that an E-mail was received. For the purposes of this Agreement, any and all notices shall be addressed to the contacts listed below:

- 10.9 Integration of Understanding: This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties hereto and neither it, nor the rights and obligations hereunder, may be changed, modified, or waived except by an instrument in writing that is signed by the parties hereto.
- 10.10 Severability: If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be unenforceable or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in effect, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with the terms contained herein.
- 10.11 Authorization: Each party represents and warrants that it has the power and ability to enter into this Agreement, to grant the rights granted herein, and to perform the duties and obligations herein described.

11 COMPLIANCE WITH C.R.S. § 8-17.5-101, ET. SEQ. AS AMENDED 5/13/08: Pursuant to Colorado Revised Statute (C.R.S.), § 8-17.5-101, et. seq., as amended May 13,

2008, ACED shall meet the following requirements prior to signing this Agreement (public contract for service) and for the duration thereof:

- 11.1 ACED shall certify participation in the E-Verify Program (the electronic employment verification program that is authorized in 8 U.S.C. § 1324a and jointly administered by the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration, or its successor program) or the Department Program (the employment verification program established by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment pursuant to C.R.S. § 8-17.5-102(5)) on the attached certification.
- 11.2 ACED shall not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien to perform work under this public contract for services.
- 11.3 ACED shall not enter into a contract with a subcontractor that fails to certify to ACED that the subcontractor shall not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien to perform work under this public contract for services.
- 11.4 At the time of signing this public contract for services, ACED has confirmed the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment to perform work under this public contract for services through participation in either the E-Verify Program or the Department Program.
- 11.5 ACED shall not use either the E-Verify Program or the Department Program procedures to undertake pre-employment screening of job applicants while this public contract for services is being performed.
- 11.6 If ACED obtains actual knowledge that a subcontractor performing work under this public contract for services knowingly employs or contracts with an illegal alien, ACED shall: notify the subcontractor and the County within three (3) days that ACED has actual knowledge that the subcontractor is employing or contracting with an illegal alien; and terminate the subcontract with the subcontractor if within three days of receiving the notice required pursuant to the previous paragraph, the subcontractor does not stop employing or contracting with the illegal alien; except that ACED shall not terminate the contract with the subcontractor if during such three (3) days the subcontractor provides information to establish that the subcontractor has not knowingly employed or contracted with an illegal alien.
- 11.7 ACED shall comply with any reasonable requests by the Department of Labor and Employment (the Department) made in the course of an investigation that the

Department is undertaking pursuant to the authority established in C.R.S. \S 8-17.5-102(5).

If ACED violates this Section, of this Agreement, the County may terminate this Agreement for breach of contract. If the Agreement is so terminated, ACED shall be liable for actual and consequential damages to the County

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RESOLUTION APPROVING INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ADAMS COUNTY FOR COOPERATIVE WILDFIRE PROTECTION

WHEREAS, C.R.S. § 24-33.5-1221 requires intergovernmental cooperation between a county and any state agency that owns wildland areas located within the county to mitigate the harm caused by wildland fires affecting land areas in the interest of protecting the public health and safety; and,

WHEREAS, the form of the attached Intergovernmental Agreement is intended to be consistently adopted in all Colorado counties; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Sheriff is also a party to this Agreement and has approved the Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Intergovernmental Agreement Between the Colorado Department of Natural Resources and Adams County for Cooperative Wildfire Protection, a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners is authorized to sign the Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of Adams County.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ADAMS COUNTY FOR

COOPERATIVE WILDFIRE PROTECTION
Pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1221 as amended by HB 14-1210

A. PARTIES

This Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") is made by and between Adams County acting through its Board of County Commissioners (the "County"), the Sheriff of the County (the "Sheriff"), and the State of Colorado, acting by and through the Colorado Department of Natural Resources, Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife, 1313 Sherman St., Room 618, Denver, Colorado 80203 ("CPW"), and the Colorado Department of Public Safety, Division of Fire Prevention and Control, 690 Kipling Street, Suite 200, Lakewood, CO 80215 ("DFPC"). Both CPW and DFPC individually or together may also be referred to as the "State" throughout the IGA.

B. EFFECTIVE DATE AND NOTICE OF NONLIABILITY

This IGA shall not be effective or enforceable until it is approved and signed by the Colorado State Controller or designee ("Effective Date"). The State shall not be liable to pay or reimburse the County for any performance hereunder including, but not limited to, costs or expenses incurred, or be bound by any provision hereof, prior to the Effective Date.

C. RECITALS

1. Authority

The Parties are entering into this IGA pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1221, as most recently amended by House Bill 14-1210 (the "Statute"). Authority to enter into this IGA is contained in the Colorado Constitution Article XIV §18(2)(a) and in CRS §§24-33.5-1221, 29-1-203, 33-1-101, 33-1-104, 33-1-105, 33-9-101, 33-9-109 et seq., 33-10-101, 33-10-106, and 33-10-107. Nothing in this IGA alters or affects the manner in which Wildland Fire suppression activities or costs are handled during existing mutual aid periods as defined in the AOP or pursuant to any other existing agreement.

2. Consideration

The Parties acknowledge that the requirements of CRS §24-33.5-1221, the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration are sufficient and adequate to support this IGA.

3. Exhibits

The following are attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein: **EXHIBIT A** (Reimbursement Request), **EXHIBIT B** (Sample Option Letter).

4. Purpose

The purpose of this IGA is to comply with CRS §24-33.5-1221 and address mitigation and suppression of Wildland Fires affecting CPW Land within the County.

5. References

All references in this IGA to sections (whether spelled out or using the § symbol), subsections, exhibits or other attachments, are references to sections, subsections, exhibits or other attachments contained herein or incorporated as a part hereof, unless otherwise noted.

D. DEFINITIONS

As used in this IGA, the following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section. These terms are in addition to terms defined otherwise in this IGA and defined in CRS §24-33.5-1221.

1. Annual Operating Plan or AOP

"AOP" means a planning document regarding how interparty cooperation is to be implemented within the County. It is intended that any such document will be adopted on an annual basis by, between and among pertinent parties. Such parties might include the County, the Sheriff, DFPC, federal land agencies, and/or other participants.

2. CPW Land

"CPW Land" means all Forest Land, Rangeland, and Wildland Areas that are owned by CPW and located within the County, provided however that, pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1221 the following are excluded from the definition of CPW Land: all lands within the boundaries of incorporated cities or towns; lands owned or controlled by the federal government or any agency thereof; and, land in which CPW merely holds a right-of-way interest or conservation easement, or state trust lands. CPW will provide the County with an inventory and map of CPW Land located within a County at the outset of the IGA and upon request by the County.

3. CRS

"CRS" means the Colorado Revised Statutes, as amended.

4. Federal Land

"Federal Land" as defined by CRS §34-33-103(9) means any land, including mineral interests, owned by the United States, but excluding Tribal Lands.

5. Fire Use Restrictions

"Fire Use Restrictions" means any burning restriction enacted pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1225 or by the County pursuant to CRS §30-15-401(1)(n.5)(I).

6. Forest Land

"Forest Land" as defined by CRS §24-33.5-1221(2)(a)(I) means land of which at least 10 percent is stocked by forest trees of any size and includes land that formerly had such tree cover and that will be naturally or artificially regenerated. Forest Land includes roadside, streamside, and shelterbelt strips of timber having a crown width of at least 120 feet. Forest Land includes unimproved roads and trails, streams, and clearings that are less than 120 feet wide.

7. Incident Commander

"Incident Commander" as defined by CRS §29-22.5-102(2) means the individual responsible for the overall management of the incident including developing incident

objectives and managing all incident operations, by virtue of explicit legal, agency, or delegated authority.

8. Intergovernmental Agreement or IGA

"Intergovernmental Agreement" or "IGA" means this IGA, its terms and conditions, attached exhibits, documents incorporated by reference under the terms of this IGA, and any future modifying agreements, exhibits, attachments or references incorporated herein pursuant to Colorado State law, Fiscal Rules, and State Controller Policies.

9. National Fire Incident Reporting System or NFIRS

"National Fire Incident Reporting System" or "NFIRS" means the reporting standards system established by the United States Fire Administration.

10. National Wildfire Coordinating Group or NWCG

"National Wildfire Coordinating Group" or "NWCG" means the operational group established through the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Department of the Interior, International Association of Fire Chiefs, Intertribal Timber Council, National Association of State Foresters, and the U.S. Fire Administration, and which provides national leadership to develop, maintain, and communicate interagency standards, guidelines, qualifications, training and other capabilities that enable interoperable wildland fire operations among federal and non-federal entities.

11. Party or Parties

"Party" means the County, the Sheriff, CPW, or DFPC, and "Parties" mean the County, the Sheriff, CPW, and DFPC, or a combination of them.

12. Rangeland

"Rangeland" as defined by CRS §24-33.5-1221(2)(a)(II) means an expanse of land that is unforested and on which it is suitable for livestock to wander and graze.

13. Resource Advisor

"Resource Advisor" means the party primarily responsible for identifying and evaluating potential impacts and benefits of Wildland Fires on natural and cultural resources.

14. State Fiscal Year

"State Fiscal Year" means the period of time from July 1 of each calendar year through and including June 30 of the following calendar year.

15. State Responsibility Fire

"State Responsibility Fire" means a Wildland Fire that exceeds the County and the Sheriff's capability to control or extinguish and for which DFPC has determined that the fire meets the criteria for the Emergency Fire Fund.

16. Tribal Land

"Tribal Land" means all lands, including, but not limited to, mineral interests and rights-of-way, within the exterior boundaries of any federal Indian reservation, notwithstanding the issuance of any patent, including mineral interests held in trust for or supervised by any Indian tribe.

17. Wildland Area

"Wildland Area." Pursuant to CRS § 24-33.5-1221(2)(a)(IV), "Wildland Area" means an area in which development is essentially nonexistent, except for roads, railroads, power lines, and similar infrastructure, and in which structures, if present, are widely scattered.

18. Wildland Fire

"Wildland Fire." As defined in CRS §24-33.5-1221(2)(a)(V), "Wildland Fire" means an unplanned or unwanted fire in a forest land, rangeland, or Wildland Area, including an unauthorized human-caused fire in a forest land, an out-of-control prescribed fire, and any other fire in a forest land, rangeland, or Wildland Area where the objective is to extinguish the fire.

19. Wildfire Emergency Response Fund

"Wildfire Emergency Response Fund" means those funds available to DFPC pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1226.

20. Wildfire Suppression Costs

"Wildfire Suppression Costs" means the costs incurred to suppress any Wildland Fire.

E. MITIGATION AND SUPPRESSION OF WILDLAND FIRES

1. Relationship between the County and the Sheriff

The responsibilities of and division of duties between the County and the Sheriff are governed by applicable law.

2. Procedures for Cooperation and Coordination

The procedures for cooperation and coordination among the Parties are as follows:

i. Notification

The County shall notify the DFPC Fire Management Officer or the DFPC Fire Duty Officer of fire suspected on CPW Land within 24 hours of the County becoming aware of a fire or suspected fire. CPW shall provide notification to the DFPC Fire Duty Officer of any fire suspected on CPW lands within 24 hours of becoming aware of a fire or suspected fire.

ii. Reporting

Prior to or concurrently with the submission of any reimbursement request under this IGA, the County shall ensure that the Wildland Fire incident information is entered into NFIRS and shall provide DFPC with geographic information systems data or a detailed map of the Wildland Fire perimeter.

3. Management Objectives

The management objectives of CPW are as follows:

- i. Prevention
 - a. Fire Use Restriction

Under the terms of the County's AOP, if applicable, CPW will coordinate with the County in complying with Fire Use Restrictions.

b. Media

The Parties may coordinate public fire prevention messages provided to the media.

ii. Preparedness

CPW may, in coordination with the County, develop fire management plans and/or emergency operations plans for CPW Land to identify fire management objectives. CPW shall share any pre-determined or developed fire management plans for CPW Lands located within the County with the County.

iii. Mitigation

CPW will plan, prioritize and implement hazardous fuels reduction and defensible space projects, as funding allows, on CPW Land using recognized standards or

best practices. CPW, in its sole discretion, will include fuels reduction and Wildland Fire prevention goals in habitat improvement projects in the Wildland Area-urban interface to the extent that CPW determines it possible.

iv. Suppression

Wildland Fire suppression responsibilities on non-Federal Lands in Colorado are governed by CRS §29-22.5-103 and §30-10-513, which sets forth a hierarchy of local jurisdiction from County Sheriff to State of Colorado, with the DFPC being the lead state agency for Wildland Fire management.

- a. Resource Advisor
 - Under the terms of the County's AOP, if applicable, CPW regional staff or their designee may act as a Resource Advisor for Wildland Fires occurring within the County on CPW Land in accordance with NWCG standards contained in the Resource Advisor's Guide for Wildland Fire, publication #313.
- b. Reimbursement CPW will make reimbursement funding available for the County for Wildfire Suppression Costs in accordance with §G.
- v. Reclamation

CPW is responsible for all reclamation activities designed to restore damage from suppression activities on CPW Land.

vi. Rehabilitation

CPW is responsible for the cost of long term post-fire rehabilitation on CPW Land, including but not limited to restoration of habitat, and reducing threats of noxious weeds and erosion.

F. EMERGENCY AND MUTUAL AID RESOURCES

In the event of Wildland Fires, emergency and mutual aid resources may be available from multiple nonprofit, local, state, and federal fire agencies pursuant to applicable cooperative agreements, mutual aid agreements, and AOPs. This IGA is not intended to affect, limit, or reduce any Party's access to, application for, or acquisition of any such other aid resources that may become available outside of this IGA.

G. REIMBURSEMENTS TO THE COUNTY

1. Reimbursement

i. CPW shall, in accordance with the provisions of this IGA, provide reimbursement to the County for certain costs the County and/or Sheriff incurs during the suppression of a Wildland Fire on CPW Land. The total amount of such reimbursement will be based on a cost share method included in the AOP if applicable, or the overall cost of suppression efforts incurred during any such Wildland Fire and the ratio of CPW Land to non-CPW Land involved in the Wildland Fire if the AOP is not applicable. Costs incurred during the mutual aid period or recoverable through other mechanisms, including but not limited to the Wildland Emergency Response Fund and the Colorado Firefighting Air Corps, and costs incurred by the County or Sheriff during a State Responsibility Fire, including those related to the County's minimum commitment, are not subject to reimbursement through this IGA..

ii. To obtain reimbursement for eligible suppression costs, the Sheriff, the County, or both shall submit to DFPC a completed reimbursement request as provided in **Exhibit A**.

- iii. DFPC shall review each reimbursement request submitted in accordance with the provisions of this IGA and, if validated and funds are available, pay the amount of approved reimbursement to the requesting Party.
- iv. The following are conditions precedent to approval of any reimbursement request:
 - a. The County shall have made notification and ensured reporting as set forth in §E.2.i and §E.2.ii.
 - b. DFPC receives the reimbursement request as submitted in accordance with **§K** in writing in the same State Fiscal Year in which Wildfire Suppression Costs, for which the County or Sheriff seek reimbursement, are incurred. If the County cannot submit a final reimbursement request within the same State Fiscal Year, the County may provide a written estimate of the anticipated expenses within 10 days from the end of the pertinent State Fiscal Year. Estimates submitted by the County under this section are necessary for State accounting purposes and should contain basic information related to the expected amount of expenses incurred.
 - c. The County or Sheriff provides documentation of costs in form and substance acceptable to DFPC.
 - d. CPW and DFPC validate the costs as reimbursable in accordance with the provisions of this IGA and as required by statute.

2. Maximum Amount

- The maximum amount payable over the entire term of this IGA by CPW pursuant to statute and this IGA is \$626,500. The actual amount payable arises on a discrete Wildland Fire incident per State Fiscal Year basis. This amount is drawn from pooled funding for all counties, including the County, who enter into a like intergovernmental agreement with the State pursuant to CRS §24-33.5-1221. As such, the State will make reimbursements under the IGA or to other counties on a first-come, first-reimbursed basis, determined by date and time when DFPC receives a complete and acceptable reimbursement request pursuant to this IGA, until available funds are fully expended either in payment under this IGA or to other counties. CPW does not guarantee any minimum reimbursement or that there are funds available for any reimbursement under this IGA. Funding for reimbursement of Wildfire Suppression Costs derives from appropriations approved by the Colorado General Assembly for the purpose of this IGA, and payments under this IGA are limited to the unpaid obligated balance of such appropriations, on a State Fiscal Year basis. The maximum amount payable by the State under this IGA during each State Fiscal Year is \$89,500.
- ii. The State is prohibited by law from making commitments beyond the term of the State's current fiscal year. Therefore, payments under this IGA beyond the State's current Fiscal Year are contingent upon the continuing availability of State appropriations as provided in the Colorado Special Provisions contained in §M of this IGA. If federal funds are used to fund this IGA, in whole or in part, the State's performance hereunder is contingent upon the continuing availability of such funds. Payments pursuant to this IGA shall be made only from available

funds encumbered for this IGA, and the State's liability for such payments shall be limited to the amount remaining of such encumbered funds. If State or federal funds are not appropriated, or otherwise become unavailable to fund this IGA, the State may terminate this IGA immediately, in whole or in part, without further liability in accordance with the provisions hereof.

3. Erroneous Payments

At the State's sole discretion, the State may recover payments that were made in error under this IGA to the County or Sheriff.

H. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 1. The Parties' respective performances under the initial term of this IGA shall commence on the later of either the Effective Date or January 1, 2017. This IGA shall terminate on **June 30, 2023** unless sooner terminated or further extended as specified elsewhere herein.
 - a. This IGA shall automatically terminate upon the date CRS §24-33.5-1221 is repealed if repealed.
 - b. This IGA shall automatically terminate if the Parties enter into a separate agreement that satisfies the requirements of CRS §24-33.5-1221.
 - c. The County may terminate this IGA by providing written notice of termination to CPW as provided in §K.
 - d. CPW, at its discretion, shall have the option to extend the performance under this IGA beyond the initial term for a period, or for successive periods, of one and half years (18 months) or less under the same terms specified in this IGA (each such period an "Extension Term"). In order to exercise this option, the State shall provide written notice to County in a form substantially equivalent to **Exhibit B**. Except as stated in §H.1.e., the total duration of this Agreement, including the exercise of any options to extend, shall not exceed 10 years from its Effective Date absent prior approval from the State Purchasing Director in accordance with the Colorado Procurement Code.
 - e. CPW, at its discretion and upon written notice to the County and DFPC, shall have the option to extend the performance under this IGA for a period not to exceed two months if the Parties are negotiating a replacement IGA at or near the end of the initial term or renewal term. The provisions of this IGA in effect when such notice is given, including, but not limited to prices, rates, and delivery requirements, shall remain in effect during the two-month extension. The two month extension shall immediately terminate when and if a replacement IGA is approved and signed by the Colorado State Controller.

I. REMEDIES

If any Party fails to perform as required under this IGA, any other Party may send notice of such non-performance as provided in **§K**. Such notice shall describe the non-performance, the action or actions the non-performing Party needs to take to cure the non-performance, and the date by when such action or actions need to occur. If the non-performing Party fails to cure the non-performance, the other Party or Parties may avail themselves of remedies available by law.

J. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event of disputes concerning performance hereunder or otherwise related to this IGA, the Parties shall attempt to resolve them at the lowest staff level practicable. If this fails, disputes shall be referred to senior departmental management staff designated by each Party. If this fails, the Director of CPW, the Director of DFPC, the Sheriff, and a representative of the County's Board of Commissioners shall meet and attempt resolution. If this fails, a Party may seek judicial relief.

K. NOTICES

Each individual identified below is the principal representative of the designating Party. All notices required to be given hereunder shall be hand delivered with receipt required or sent by certified or registered mail to such Party's principal representative at the address set forth below. In addition to, but not in lieu of a hard-copy notice, notice also may be sent by e-mail to the e-mail addresses, if any, set forth below. Either Party may from time to time designate by written notice substitute addresses or persons to whom such notices shall be sent. Unless otherwise provided herein, all notices shall be effective upon receipt.

L. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. Assignment and Subcontracts

Each Party's rights and obligations hereunder are personal and may not be transferred, assigned or subcontracted. Any attempt at assignment, transfer, subcontracting without such consent shall be void. All assignments, subcontracts, or subcontractors approved by any Party are subject to all of the provisions hereof.

2. Binding Effect

All provisions herein contained, including the benefits and burdens, shall extend to and be binding upon the Parties' respective heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

3. Captions

The captions and headings in this IGA are for convenience of reference only, and shall not be used to interpret, define, or limit its provisions.

4. CORA Disclosure

To the extent not prohibited by federal law, this IGA and the performance measures and standards under CRS §24-103.5-101, if any, are subject to public release through the Colorado Open Records Act, CRS §24-72-200.1, et seq.

5. Counterparts

This IGA may be executed in multiple identical original counterparts, all of which shall constitute one agreement.

6. Jurisdiction and Venue

All suits or actions related to this IGA shall be filed and proceedings held in the State of Colorado and exclusive venue shall be in Colorado.

7. Entire Understanding

This IGA represents the complete integration of all understandings related to CRS §24-33.5-1221 between the Parties and all prior representations and understandings, oral or written, are merged herein. Prior or contemporaneous additions, deletions, or other changes hereto shall not have any force or effect whatsoever, unless embodied herein.

8. Modifications

i. By the Parties

Except as specifically provided in this IGA, modifications of this IGA shall not be effective unless agreed to in writing by the Parties in an amendment to this IGA, properly executed and approved in accordance with applicable Colorado State law, State Fiscal Rules. Modifications permitted under this IGA, other than contract amendments, shall conform with the Policies of the Office of the State Controller, including, but not limited to, the policy entitled MODIFICATIONS OF CONTRACTS - TOOLS AND FORMS.

ii. By Operation of Law

This IGA is subject to such modifications as may be required by changes in Federal or Colorado State law, or their implementing regulations. Any such required modification shall automatically be incorporated into and be part of this IGA on the effective date of such change, as if fully set forth herein

9. Order of Precedence

The provisions of this IGA shall govern the relationship of the Parties. In the event of conflicts or inconsistencies between this IGA and its exhibits and attachments, such conflicts or inconsistencies shall be resolved by reference to the documents in the following order of priority:

- i. The Colorado Special Provisions
- ii. The provisions of the main body of the IGA
- iii. Exhibit A (Reimbursement Request)
- iv. Exhibit B (Sample Option Letter)

10. Severability

Provided this IGA can be executed and performance of the obligations of the Parties accomplished within its intent, the provisions hereof are severable and any provision that is declared invalid or becomes inoperable for any reason shall not affect the validity of any other provision hereof, provided that the Parties can continue to perform their obligations under this IGA in accordance with its intent.

11. Survival of Certain IGA Terms

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, provisions of this IGA requiring continued performance, compliance, or effect after termination hereof, shall survive such termination and shall be enforceable if any Party fails to perform or comply as required

12. Taxes

The State is exempt from all federal excise taxes under IRC Chapter 32 (No. 84-730123K) and from all State and local government sales and use taxes under CRS §§39-26-101 and 201 et seq. Such exemptions apply when materials are purchased or services are rendered to benefit the State; provided however, that certain political subdivisions (e.g., City of Denver) may require payment of sales or use taxes even though the product or service is provided to the State. The County shall be solely liable for paying such taxes as the State is prohibited from paying or reimbursing the County for such taxes.

13. Third Party Beneficiaries

Enforcement of this IGA and all rights and obligations hereunder are reserved solely to the Parties. Any services or benefits which third parties receive as a result of this IGA are incidental to the IGA, and do not create any rights for such third parties.

14. Waiver

Waiver of any breach under a term, provision, or requirement of this IGA, or any right or remedy hereunder, whether explicitly or by lack of enforcement, shall not be construed or deemed as a waiver of any subsequent breach of such term, provision or requirement, or of any other term, provision, or requirement

M. COLORADO SPECIAL PROVISIONS

These Special Provisions apply to all contracts except where noted in italics.

1. CONTROLLER'S APPROVAL. CRS §24-30-202 (1).

This IGA shall not be valid until it has been approved by the Colorado State Controller or designee.

2. FUND AVAILABILITY. CRS §24-30-202(5.5).

Financial obligations of the State payable after the current fiscal year are contingent upon funds for that purpose being appropriated, budgeted, and otherwise made available.

3. GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY.

No term or condition of this IGA shall be construed or interpreted as a waiver, express or implied, of any of the immunities, rights, benefits, protections, or other provisions, of the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, CRS §24-10-101 et seq., or the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. §§1346(b) and 2671 et seq., as applicable now or hereafter amended.

4. County shall perform its duties independently and not as an employee of the State. Neither County nor any agent or employee of County shall be deemed to be an agent or employee of the State. County and its employees and agents are not entitled to unemployment insurance or workers compensation benefits through the State and the State shall not pay for or otherwise provide such coverage for County or any of its agents or employees. Unemployment insurance benefits will be available to County and its employees and agents only if such coverage is made available by County or a third party. County shall pay when due all applicable employment taxes and income taxes and local

head taxes incurred pursuant to this IGA. County shall not have authorization, express or implied, to bind the State to any agreement, liability or understanding, except as expressly set forth herein. County shall (a) provide and keep in force workers' compensation and unemployment compensation insurance in the amounts required by law, (b) provide proof thereof when requested by the State, and (c) be solely responsible for its acts and those of its employees and agents.

5. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW.

County shall strictly comply with all applicable federal and State laws, rules, and regulations in effect or hereafter established, including, without limitation, laws applicable to discrimination and unfair employment practices.

6. CHOICE OF LAW.

Colorado law, and rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto, shall be applied in the interpretation, execution, and enforcement of this IGA. Any provision included or incorporated herein by reference which conflicts with said laws, rules, and regulations shall be null and void. Any provision incorporated herein by reference which purports to negate this or any other Special Provision in whole or in part shall not be valid or enforceable or available in any action at law, whether by way of complaint, defense, or otherwise. Any provision rendered null and void by the operation of this provision shall not invalidate the remainder of this IGA, to the extent capable of execution.

7. BINDING ARBITRATION PROHIBITED.

The State of Colorado does not agree to binding arbitration by any extra-judicial body or person. Any provision to the contrary in this IGA or incorporated herein by reference shall be null and void.

8. SOFTWARE PIRACY PROHIBITION. Governor's Executive Order D 002 00. State or other public funds payable under this IGA shall not be used for the acquisition, operation, or maintenance of computer software in violation of federal copyright laws or applicable licensing restrictions. County hereby certifies and warrants that, during the term of this IGA and any extensions, County has and shall maintain in place appropriate systems and controls to prevent such improper use of public funds. If the State determines that County is in violation of this provision, the State may exercise any remedy available at law or in equity or under this IGA, including, without limitation, immediate termination of this IGA and any remedy consistent with federal copyright laws or applicable licensing restrictions.

9. EMPLOYEE FINANCIAL INTEREST/CONFLICT OF INTEREST. CRS §§24-18201 and 24-50-507.

The signatories aver that to their knowledge, no employee of the State has any personal or beneficial interest whatsoever in the service or property described in this IGA. County has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of County's services and County shall not employ any person having such known interests.

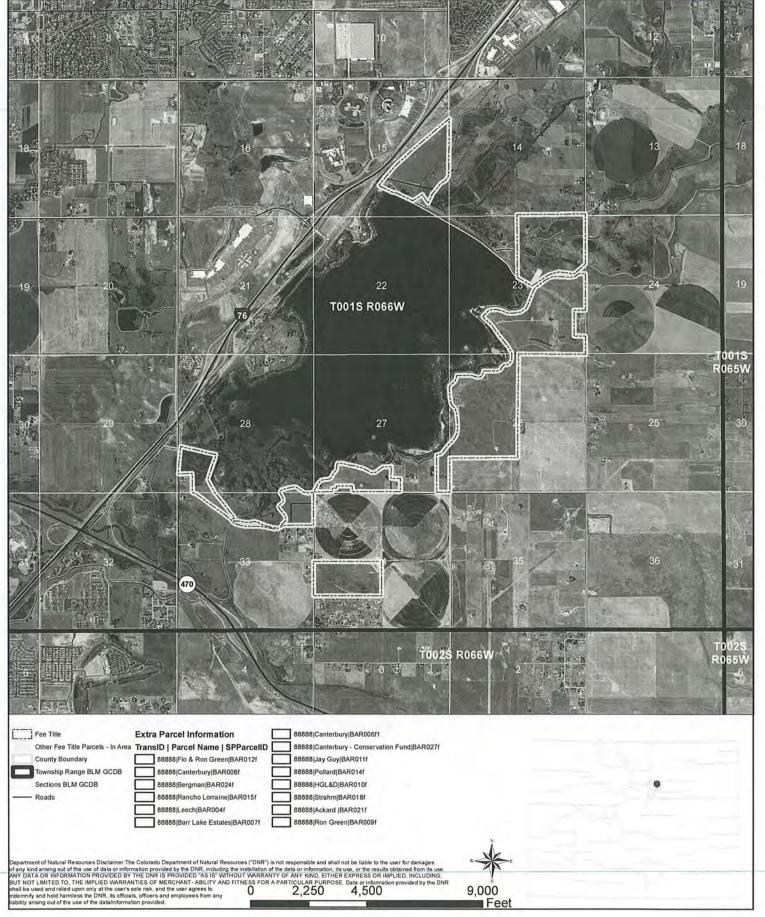

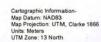

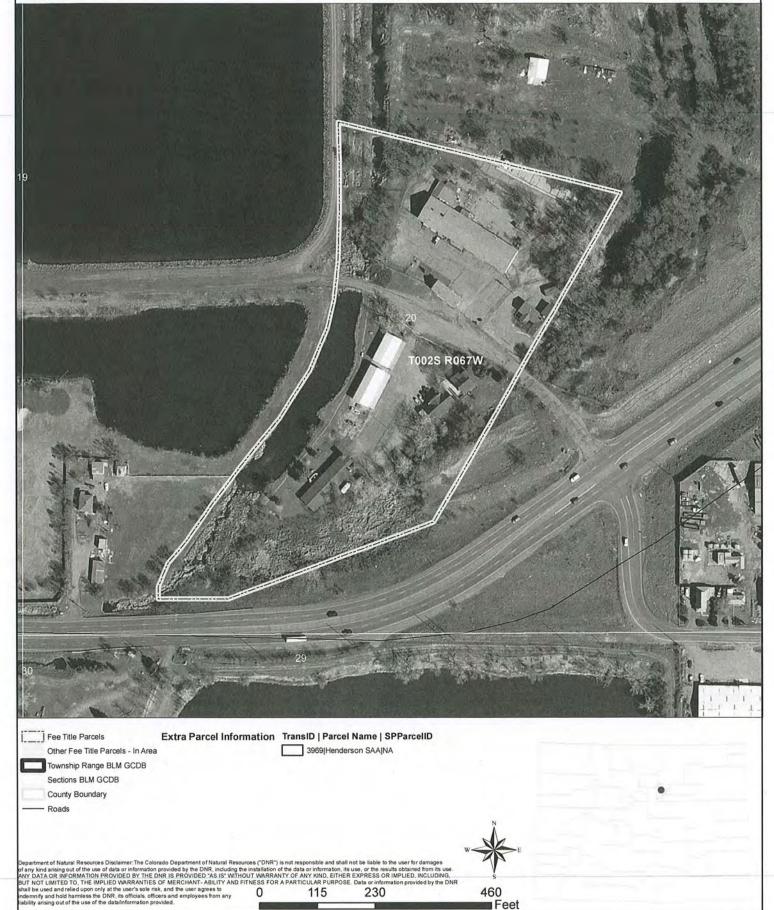

BACKGROUND:

The Human Services Department has provided a short-term case management program for "child only" Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) cases called Stable Families since 1999. The program assists specified caretaker families and families with parents who are in the home, but not eligible for TANF Basic Cash Assistance (BCA). The goal of the program is to stabilize children in their home or the home of a relative through referrals to community services providers with the assistance of resources, and supportive services, to assist with custody or adoption when appropriate.

The County awarded the original agreement on March 22, 2016. At this time, the Human Services Department Workforce and Business Center (TANF) is requesting the renewal of the agreement with Family Tree, Inc., to provide the TANF Stable Families program for families who are eligible for (TANF) in Adams County. The fees include program expenses for; staff, rent, utilities, insurance, phone service, client education, assisting clients seeking employment, criminal background investigations, supplies, mileage, printing, postage, and legal clinic expenses.

Family Tree currently provides high quality short-term case management services for three (3) months on average through their program for Adams County for specified caretaker families and families with parents who are in the home, but not eligible for TANF Basic Cash Assistance (BCA).

These services are in accordance with the standards of Adams County and the State of Colorado; including, the timely provision of family stabilizing resources/supportive services, evaluation of family stability and safety of children, identification of additional family needs to stabilize children in their home or the home of a relative, assist with custody/adoption when appropriate, and connection with community resources.

Family Tree, Inc. has met the Human Services Department's expectations for the initial term of the agreement. They assisted 83 first-time families (111 annualized), provided services and support to 7 reactivated families, and 24 non-first-time families. In addition, nine (9) families were assisted with custody/guardianship, to include; 61 cases being closed in the first nine (9) months of the agreement, 18 cases were connected to a recurrent resource, and 9 were connected to more than one recurrent resource.

The Human Services Department received a TANF Block Grant from the State to assist with the goals of the Workforce and Business Center (TANF) program in 2015. The grant awarded will provide eighty-five (85%) percent funding, with Adams County responsible for the remaining fifteen (15%) percent.

The fees for the first year renewal will be in the amount of two-hundred seventeen thousand, nine-hundred, thirty dollars (\$217,930.00). The service effective date will begin March 1, 2017 through February 28, 2018.

APPROVAL with 11 Findings-of-Fact, 1 Condition, and 1 Note		

SUMMARY OF PREVIOUS APPLICATIONS

On June 12, 2013, staff and the applicant held a conceptual review meeting to discuss a proposed subdivision to create three single-family lots on the property.

The property currently has an active zoning violation for having a single-family residence and a modular home on the property in the R-1-C zone district, where only one single-family home is allowed on a single property. The subject request for a minor subdivision could resolve the code

violation by providing options for the property owner to move the modular home onto one of the newly created lots or attaching it to the existing single-family home.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

Background:

Cecil Rickstrew, the professional engineer (P.E.) hired by the property owner, is requesting a minor subdivision (preliminary/final plat) to create 3 residential lots on approximately 0.87 acres. Currently, the site is developed with one single-family dwelling, built in 1930 and one modular home. The modular home was placed on the property without first obtaining County approval. The remainder of the site is undeveloped. The proposed minor subdivision will create one lot for the existing home and two new lots for future development of single-family residences. The property abuts West 55th Place to the north. Surrounding properties to the east, west, and south are all developed as single-family residential. The developed properties to the north include multi-family and a Public Service of Colorado (Xcel Energy) substation.

Development Standards and Regulations Requirements:

The subject property is designated Residential Single-Family (R-1-C). The purpose of this zone designation is to serve exclusively as a single-family district for smaller home sites. Per Chapter 3 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations, the minimum lot size permitted in the R-1-C zone district is seven thousand (7,000) square feet for internal lots. The proposed plat consists of three lots. These lots range in size from 9,880 square feet (0.23 acre) to 14,592 square feet (0.34 acre). Each of the lots conforms to the minimum lot size required for the R-1-C zone district. In addition, the minimum lot width required in the R-1-C district is sixty-five feet (65 ft) for internal lots. The proposed lots have widths ranging from 65 to 96 feet, which conforms to the minimum lot width requirement.

Per Section 5-03-03 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, subdivision plats and lot dimensions shall conform to requirements of the zone district in which the property is located. In addition, all lots created by a subdivision shall have access on a County maintained right-of-way. The proposed subdivision plat conforms to the minimum lot dimensions of the R-1-C zone district. In addition, each of the proposed lot will have access to a public right-of-way (i.e. W. 55TH Place).

The property is surrounded to the east, south, and west by single-family residential subdivisions. Currently, the subject site and adjoining properties are located in the Lincoln Manor Subdivision, approved by the County in 1921. This subdivision consists of 54 plots, with an average lot size of 0.82 of an acre. Located to the south of the subject site is the Berkeley Gardens Subdivision No. 1 and No. 2. These subdivisions were approved in 1916 and 1918 respectively. The subdivision originally consisted of 71 lots with each lot size being approximately 0.68 of an acre. There are a number of smaller subdivisions consisting of two or three lots located within close proximity of the subject site. These include Adams Grove (1983), Herrera Minor (2011), Majalca (2002), Gash (1995), L & B (1985), and Walkers (1978) subdivisions. The proposed subdivision is consistent with type and density of development in the surrounding area and conforms to the County's Development Standards and Regulations.

Minor Subdivision (Preliminary/Final Plat):

The proposed plat conforms to the criteria for approval outlined in Section 2-02-18-03-05 of the County's Development Standards, which include conformance with the subdivision design standards, sufficient water and sanitation facilities, and adequate public infrastructure. The applicant has provided a letter of intent from Berkeley Water and Sanitation District demonstrating the District's ability to provide services to the development, thus satisfying evidence of adequate water and sanitation facilities to serve the site. All proposed drainage facilities in the development have been reviewed and approved by the County's Development Services Engineering. In addition, staff reviewed documentation showing provision of adequate public infrastructure to support the development. Section 5-02 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations requires provision of public improvements with all subdivision plats. The required improvements are normally approved and constructed through a Subdivision Improvements Agreement (SIA) and associated collateral to guarantee construction of the improvements.

Subdivision Improvements Agreement:

Per Section 5-02-05 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations, a Subdivision Improvements Agreement (SIA) is required for the proposed development. The agreement is required to address the manner and timing of the completion of all subdivision improvements, including responsibility for payment of the costs of the improvements associated with the development.

The SIA outlines the Developer's obligation for required construction and collateral for all public improvements. Staff has reviewed the associated SIA submitted with the application and confirmed the proposed agreement complies with the County's Development Standards and Regulations.

Future Land Use Designation/Comprehensive Plan:

The subject property is designated as Urban Residential in the County's Future Land Use Map. Per Chapter 5 of the Adams County Comprehensive Plan, Urban Residential areas are intended to provide a variety of housing types, and create and maintain healthy residential neighborhoods. Primary uses in the Urban Residential future land use designation are single and multiple-family housing developed at densities of one dwelling unit per acre or greater. Surrounding properties to the north, south, east, and west of the subject property are also designated as Urban Residential.

The property is also located in the Southwest Adams County Framework plan. This plan was adopted as an amendment to the County's Comprehensive Plan, and outlines existing conditions and direction for future planning efforts in certain sections of the County. Specifically, the Framework Plan identifies the southwest portion of the County as containing most of the older, more urbanized areas of the County as well as a wide range and mix of land uses. The Framework Plan identifies policies and strategies outlined in the County's Comprehensive Plan, such as maintaining and enhancing the quality of existing residential neighborhoods and enhancing the Southwest area's role as an important gateway to the County.

The subject request conforms to goals of the Comprehensive Plan and the Southwest Framework Plan. The request is for development of a single family residential subdivision that is compatible with surrounding residential subdivisions. In addition, the development will utilize existing infrastructure as well as construct public improvements such as curb, gutter and sidewalk, which will help enhance the general area.

Site Characteristics:

Currently, the site is developed with one single family dwelling, built in 1930 and one modular home. The remainder of the site is undeveloped. The proposed minor subdivision will create one lot for the existing home and two new lots for future development of single-family residences.

Compatibility with the Surrounding Land Uses:

The request is compatible with surrounding zone designations, existing development in the area, and the Comprehensive Plan Urban Residential future land use designation.

Referral Comments:

The Adams County Development Review Engineering reviewed the subject request and stated the site is located within an MS4 Permitted Area; however, a County Stormwater Quality Permit is not required as the development will create less than one acre of disturbance. Also, all construction and drainage plans have been reviewed and approved by the Development Engineering Division.

The Colorado Division of Water Resources reviewed the request and stated the proposed subdivision has adequate water supply. Xcel Energy also reviewed the proposed subdivision and requested the applicant to show location of all utility easements on the final plat. All utility and drainage easements are identified on the final plat. Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) and Adams County Fire Rescue also reviewed the request and had no concerns.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on January 12, 2017, and unanimously recommended approval of the request. During the hearing, the PC asked the applicant to confirm if the existing dwelling is used as a rental property and also explain his intention for using the modular home in a manner that complies with the County's Development Standards and

Regulations. The applicant informed the PC that the existing single-family home is used for rental. For the modular home, he explained that he intends to attach it to the existing single family home, which will make it conform to the County Development Standards of one dwelling per lot. The PC and staff reiterated that the attachment of the modular home to the existing home on the property will require conformance to the adopted building code. The applicant stated that he understood this requirement. There was no public testimony provided at the hearing.

Staff Recommendations:

Although the property has been cited with a code violation for multiple dwellings in a single-family zone district, the violation can be resolved through a building permit application to bring the property into compliance. The proposed subdivision conforms to all criteria of approval including adequate water and sanitation and adequate public infrastructure, including installation of curb, gutter, and sidewalk. In addition, staff has recommended a condition of approval requiring a building permit for the modular dwelling to ensure the structure is properly placed within required setbacks and properly installed with a foundation.

Based upon the application, the criteria for approving a minor subdivision (preliminary/final plat), and a recent site visit, staff recommends Approval of this request with 11 findings-of-fact, 1 Condition, and 1 Note.

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS-OF-FACT

- 1. The final plat is consistent and conforms to the approved sketch plat.
- 2. The final plat is in conformance with the subdivision design standards.
- 3. The applicant has provided evidence that a sufficient water supply has been acquired in terms of quantity, quality, and dependability for the type of subdivision proposed, as determined in accordance with the standards set forth in the water supply standards.
- 4. The applicant has provided evidence that a public sewage disposal system has been established and, if other methods of sewage disposal are proposed, adequate evidence indicating that the system complies with state and local laws and regulations.
- 5. The applicant has provided evidence to show all areas of the proposed subdivision, which may involve soil or topographical conditions presenting hazards or requiring special precautions, have been identified by the applicant and the proposed uses of these areas are compatible with such conditions.
- 6. The proposed or constructed drainage improvements are adequate and comply with these standards and regulations.
- 7. Adequate public facilities or infrastructure, or cash-in-lieu, for impacts reasonably related to the proposed subdivision have been constructed or financially guaranteed through cash-in-lieu or a subdivision improvements agreement so the proposed subdivision will not negatively impact the levels of service of the County.

- 8. The final plat is consistent with the Adams County Comprehensive Plan and any available area plan.
- 9. The final plat is consistent with the purposes of these standards and regulations.
- 10. The overall density of development within the proposed subdivision conforms to the zone district density allowances.
- 11. The proposed subdivision is compatible with the surrounding area, harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, not detrimental to the immediate area, not detrimental to the future development of the area, and not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants of the area and the County. The proposed subdivision has established an adequate level of compatibility by:
 - a. Incorporating natural physical features into the development design and providing sufficient open spaces considering the type and intensity of use;
 - b. Incorporating site planning techniques to foster the implementation of the County's plans, and encourage a land use pattern to support a balanced transportation system, including auto, bike and pedestrian traffic, public or mass transit, and the cost effective delivery of other services consistent with adopted plans, policies and regulations of the County;
 - c. Incorporating physical design features in the subdivision to provide a transition between the project and adjacent land uses through the provision of an attractive entryway, edges along public streets, architectural design, and appropriate height and bulk restrictions on structures;
 - d. Incorporating identified environmentally sensitive areas, including but not limited to, wetlands and wildlife corridors, into the project design; and
 - e. Incorporating public facilities or infrastructure, or cash-in-lieu, reasonably related to the proposed subdivision so the proposed subdivision will not negatively impact the levels of service of the County services and facilities.

Recommended Conditions of Approval:

1. The applicant shall submit to Adams County Development Services a building permit for review and approval for placement of the modular dwelling. Any proposal to attach the modular to the existing home on the property will require compliance with the 2012 International Building Code and all other applicable adopted codes.

Recommended Notes to the Applicant:

1. All applicable building, zoning, health, engineering, and fire codes shall be adhered to with this request.

Exhibit 2.1 Applicant Written Explanation

The existing residential lot @ 3280 w 55th Place (portion of the northwest 14 section 17, township 3 south, range 68 west of the 6th P.M.) which contains one existing resident is to be subdivided into three residential lots as shown on the Site plan on D-2 with the existing residence to remain plus additions to such.

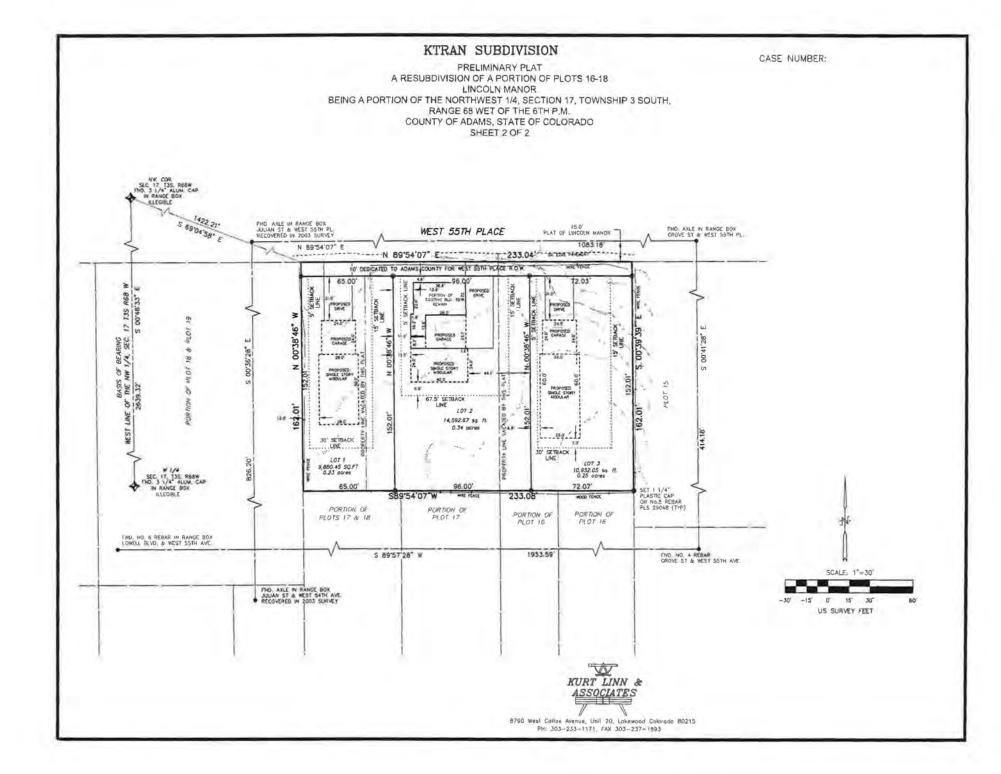
The most westerly lot is to contain a $28' \times 54'$ modular home with a full basement and a $24' \times 24'$ carport as shown on site plan D-2. The center lot is to contain the existing house $36.6' \times 22.6'$ with a $23.7' \times 38.4'$ addition and garage plus a $24' \times 40'$ modular home with a full basement. The most easterly lot is to contain a $28' \times 60'$ modular home with a full basement and a $24' \times 24'$ carport.

The most northerly 10' of the lot is to be dedicated to Adams County as part of west 55th Place right of way with 6' +/- of new asphalt street being installed and 7'-6" of mountable curb and gutter and side walk being installed by the developer of the subdivision.

A barrow ditch occurs along the north side of the east half of the existing street with a makeshift catch basin at 32' west of the northeast property corner. The barrow ditch is to be filled in and the makeshift catch basin is to be replaced with a type R catch basin to collect the street storm runoff and the runoff from the subdivision.

Water quality volume ponds will be established on the site to handle Best Management Practice water quality flows from the subdivision.

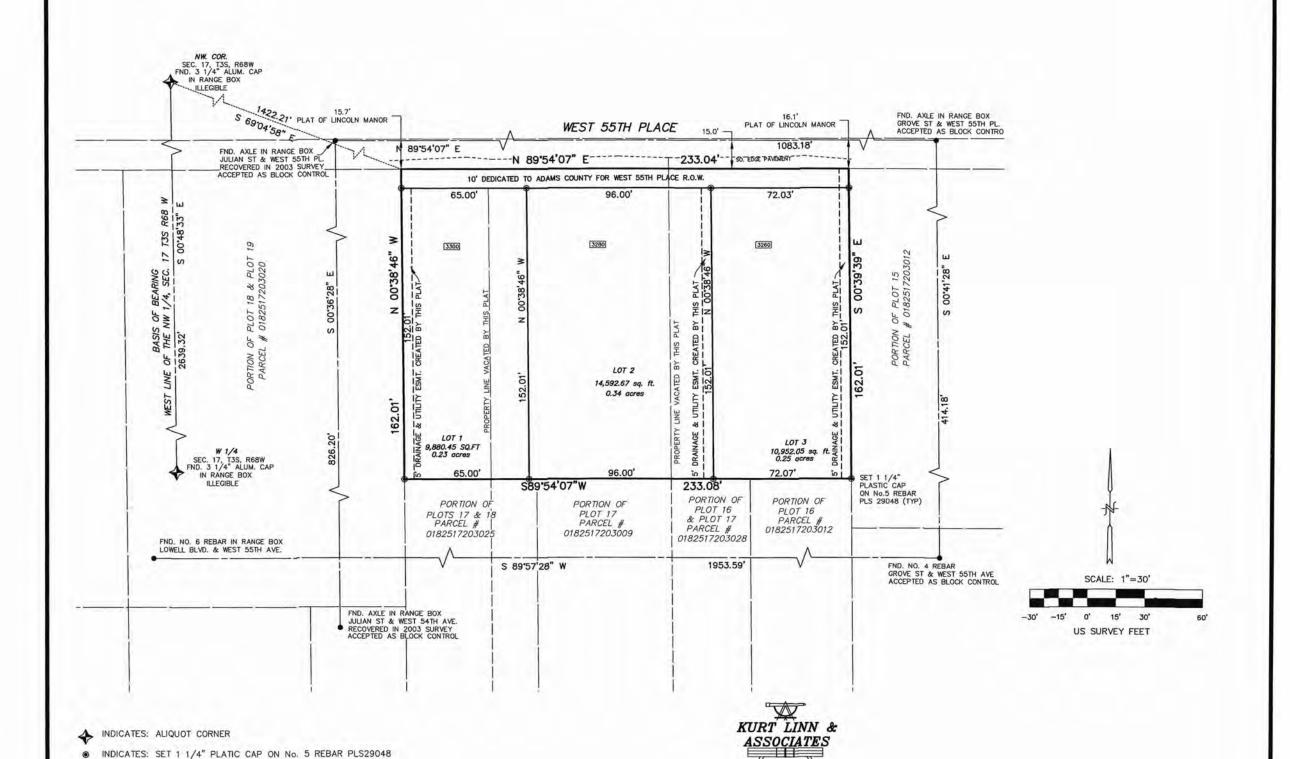

SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the County of Adams, State of Colorado, hereinafter called "County," and Khoi M. Tran, address1200 W. 70TH Ave., Denver, CO 80221 hereinafter called "Developer."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of real property in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.

WHEREAS, it is provided by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, that where designated the Developer shall have entered into a written agreement with the County to install public and/or private improvements, and to deed land for public purposes or right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto promise, covenant, and agree as follows:

- 1. **Engineering Services**. Developer shall furnish, at its own expense, all engineering and other services in connection with the design and construction of the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. **Drawings and Estimates**. The Developer shall furnish drawings and cost estimates for all improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" for approval by the County. Upon request, the Developer shall furnish one set of reproducible "as built" drawings and a final statement of construction costs to the County.
- 3. **Construction**. Developer shall furnish and construct, at its own expense and in accordance with drawings and materials approved by the County, the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B".
- 4. **Time for Completion**. Improvements shall be completed according to the terms of this agreement within "construction completion date" appearing in Exhibit "B". The County may for good cause grant extension of time for completion of any part or all of improvements appearing on said Exhibit "B". Any extension of time shall be in written form only.
- 5. Guarantee of Compliance. Developer shall furnish to the County a cash escrow deposit or other acceptable collateral, releasable only by the County, to guarantee compliance with this agreement. Said collateral shall be in the amount of \$59,528.00 including twenty percent (20%) to cover administration and five percent (5%) per year for the term of the Agreement to cover inflation. Upon approval of the final plat, completion of said improvements constructed according to the terms of this agreement, and preliminary acceptance by the Transportation Department in accordance with section 5-02-06-01 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, the collateral shall be released. Completion of said improvements shall be determined solely by the County, and a reasonable part of said collateral, up to 20%, may be retained to guarantee maintenance of public improvements for a period of one year from the date of completion.

No building permits shall be issued until said collateral is furnished in the amount required and in a form acceptable to the Board of County Commissioners, and until the final plat has been approved and the improvements described in Exhibit "B" have been preliminarily accepted by the BoCC.

- 6. Acceptance and Maintenance of Public Improvements. All improvements designated "public" on Exhibit "B" shall be public facilities and become the property of the County or other public agencies upon acceptance. During the period of one year from and after the acceptance of public improvements, the Developer shall, at its own expense, make all needed repairs or replacement due to defective materials or workmanship which, in the opinion of the County, becomes necessary. If, within ten days of written notice to the Developer from the County requesting such repairs or replacements, the Developer has not undertaken with due diligence to make the same, the County may make such repairs or replacements at the Developer's expense. In the case of an emergency such written notice may be waived.
- 7. **Successors and Assigns**. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the Developer, and shall be deemed a covenant running with the real property as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 8. **Improvements and Dedication**. The undersigned Developer hereby agrees to provide the following improvements, and to dedicate described property.
 - A. Improvements. Designate separately each public and private improvement.

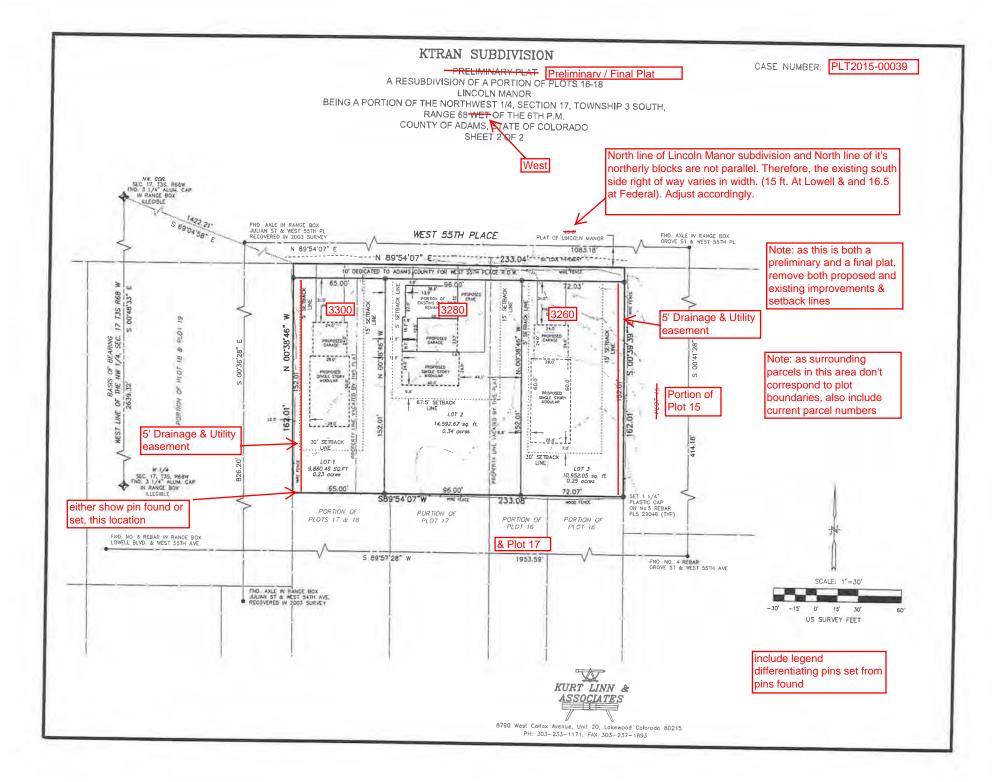

Public Service Company of Colorado's (PSCo) Right of Way & Permits Department Referral Desk has reviewed the plat for **KTRAN Subdivision**. As always, thank you for the opportunity to take part in the review process. To ensure that adequate utility easements are available within this development and per state statutes, Public Service Company requests that the following language or plat note be placed on the preliminary and final plats for the subdivision:

Six-foot (6') wide dry utility easements are hereby dedicated on private property adjacent to the front lot lines and 8-feet on the rear lot lines of each lot in the subdivision. These easements are dedicated to Adams County for the benefit of the applicable utility providers for the installation, maintenance, and replacement of electric, gas, television, cable, and telecommunications facilities (Dry Utilities). Utility easements shall also be granted within any access easements and private streets in the subdivision. Permanent structures, improvements, objects, buildings, wells, water meters and other objects that may interfere with the utility facilities or use thereof (Interfering Objects) shall not be permitted within said utility easements and the utility providers, as grantees, may remove any Interfering Objects at no cost to such grantees, including, without limitation, vegetation. Public Service Company of Colorado (PSCo) and its successors reserve the right to require additional easements and to require the property owner to grant PSCo an easement on its standard form.

Public Service Company also requests that all utility easements be depicted graphically on the preliminary and final plats. While these easements should accommodate the majority of utilities to be installed in the subdivision, some additional easements may be required as planning and building progresses.

In addition, 31-23-214 (3), C.R.S., requires the subdivider, at the time of subdivision platting, to provide for major utility facilities such as electric substation sites, gas or electric transmission line easements and gas regulator/meter station sites as deemed necessary by PSCo. While this provision will not be required on every plat, when necessary, PSCo will work with the subdivider to identify appropriate locations. This statute also requires the subdivider to submit a letter of agreement to the municipal/county commission that adequate provision of electrical and/or gas service has been provided to the subdivisions.

We have reviewed your October 5, 2015 referral concerning the above referenced proposal to subdivide a 0.82 acre parcel, described as Plots 16-18 of Lincoln Manor, into three lots. Lot 1 will be 0.23 acres and will have a new residence, Lot 2 will be 0.34 acres and will contain the existing residence and a new residence, and Lot 3 will be 0.25 acres and will contain a new residence.

Water Supply Demand

A Water Supply Information Summary Sheet was not submitted therefore, the water supply demand for this subdivision is unknown. Waste water treatment will be provided by the Berkeley Water and Sanitation District.

Source of Water Supply

According to the information submitted, the proposed water source is the Berkeley Water and Sanitation District ("District"). A letter from the District, date unknown, indicates that the District currently provides water and sewer service to 3280 West 55th Place and that the District is able to serve additional lots so long as the conditions of the District, Denver Water, and Metro Wastewater are met. The information in this office indicates that the District obtains its water supply through a distributor's "read and bill" contract with the Denver Water Department. The Denver Water Department is considered to be a reliable water source.

The application materials indicate that the proposed development will have a detention pond. The applicant should be aware that, pursuant to Colorado Senate Bill 15-212, storm water facilities must meet specific criteria to prevent them from being administered by the

Office of the State Engineer. The detention pond must be operated solely for storm water management and be subject to oversight by a governmental entity (the subdivision requirements of the county fit this criteria). Further, it must release or infiltrate at least 97 percent of all of the water from a rainfall event that is equal to or less than a five-year storm within 72 hours of the end the rainfall event. Water detained from rainfall events greater than five-year storms should be released as quickly as practicable, not to exceed the release or infiltration of 99 percent of all water within 120 hours of the end of the rainfall event. The detention pond must operate passively, not expose ground water, and not subject the storm water runoff to any active treatment process. In addition, the operator must submit notice of the proposed detention facility to the Substitute Water Supply Plan Notification List. Urban Drainage and Flood Control has created a notification portal that operators can use to satisfy this

State Engineer's Office Opinion

Based upon the above and pursuant to Section 30-28-136(1)(h)(I) and Section 30-28-136(1)(h)(II), C.R.S., the State Engineer's Office offers the opinion that with the District as the water supplier, the proposed water supply is adequate and can be provided without causing injury to decreed water rights.

Our opinion that the water supply is adequate is based on our determination that the amount of water required annually to serve the subdivision is physically available, based on current conditions.

Our opinion that the water supply can be provided without causing injury is based on our determination that the amount of water that is legally available on an annual basis for the proposed uses is greater than the annual amount of water required to supply existing water commitments and the demands of the proposed subdivision.

SUMMARY OF PREVIOUS APPLICATIONS

The subject property is part of Lot 9 of the Northside Gardens subdivision. The Subdivision was approved on August 23, 1891.

On October 2, 2009, the County issued a demolition permit to remove a garage from the property. Currently, the property is vacant and has no structure on it.

On October 6, 2016, the Board of Adjustment denied a variance request to allow the applicant to proceed to apply to rezone the property to Industrial -1 (I-1) district that does not conform to the

minimum lot size requirement of one acre for the I-I zone district. The subject property is approximately three-quarters of an acre.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

Background

The applicant, Tim Palermo, requests to rezone the property from Agricultural -1 (A-1) to Commercial-5 (C-5). According to the applicant, the property may be developed with a 3,500-sq. ft. structure after the rezoning is approved. Specifically, the structure may consist of a 500-sq. ft. of office space and 3,000 sq. ft. of warehouse space. Per Section 3-22-01 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations, the purpose of the C-5 zone district is to serve as a district for retail and services for the general public.

Development Standards and Regulations

Section 2-02-13-06-02 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations outline the criteria for approving a rezoning. In the criteria, the proposed request must be consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan, and the rezoning must be consistent with the Development Standards and Regulations, including conforming to dimensional standards of the proposed zone district. In addition, the request shall be compatible with the property's surrounding area and character of the general neighborhood. And the proposed rezoning shall not be detrimental to future development of the surrounding area or inhabitants of the area and county.

Per Section 3-22-07 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations, there is no minimum lot size requirement for developing properties in the C-5 district. Development in the C-5 district is guided by minimum lot width, setbacks (i.e. front, side, and rear), and maximum allowed height of structures. Specific requirements for the C-5 district include a minimum setback of fifty (50) feet for front property lines and minimum of fifteen (15) feet for side and rear property lines. The maximum allowed height for all structures in the C-5 district is limited to thirty-five (35) feet. The subject request conforms to the requirements of the C-5 district. Although this request is for a rezoning, the applicant has provided a conceptual site plan of intended development showing orientation buildings and overall site development. The site plan provided shows all setback requirements shall be met. Staff shall also review the site plan during the building permit review application process to ensure the plan conforms to all dimensional requirements in the C-5 District.

The intended development of the property includes 3,000 sq. ft. of warehousing and 500 sq. ft. of office space. Per the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual, the conceptual plan shows intended development of the property would generate approximately 16.18 vehicles per day. Per Section 8-02-02 of the County's Development Standards and Regulation, a traffic impact study is not required for proposed rezoning applications that do not exceed 20 vehicles per day.

Comprehensive Plan:

The Future Land Use Designation on the property is Mixed-Use Employment. Per Chapter 5 of the Adams County Comprehensive Plan, the purpose of the Mixed-Use Employment future land

use designation is to accommodate a range of employment uses with a mix of supporting uses to serve employment needs. In addition, Mixed-Used Employment areas are designated in locations that have transportation access and visibility, but are not suitable for residential development. Mixed-Use Employment areas may include offices, light manufacturing, distribution, indoor warehousing, clean industry, and supporting retail businesses.

The subject property is located within the Southwest Adams County Framework Plan's Welby Subarea Plan and considered to be part of the South Welby Area of this plan, which is identified as transitioning from agricultural and residential to industrial uses. It is a goal of the Welby Plan to promote economic development through the creation of employment hubs in the area. A rezoning of the subject property to commercial conforms to the goals and purpose of the Welby Subarea Plan.

Site Characteristics

The site is bordered to the south by East 73rd Avenue, which also serves as point of access onto the site. There are no structures on the subject property. The property measures approximately 210 feet in width (i.e. east-to-west) and 175 feet from north-to-south.

Compatibility with Surrounding Land Uses:

The subject property borders the I-1 zone district to the west, and property designated C-5 to the east. The properties to the north and immediate south are designated as A-1. The properties to the west and east are developed with warehouse uses. The property to the north is used as a water reservoir, and is owned by City of Thornton. There are two single-family residential uses located directly to the south of the site, across East 73rd Avenue. Overall, the majority of the surrounding area is developed with industrial uses. In addition, the property is located northeast of the intersection of I-25 and I-270. With industrial uses surrounding the property, rezoning and use of the site for office and warehousing will be compatible with the area and not detrimental to public health and safety.

The Future Land Use designation of Mixed-Use Employment of the general area has led to development in the area transitioning from agricultural to light industrial uses. In addition, this rezoning request is not out of character to recent development activities in the area. The request

will rezone a portion of an A-1 designated property that is located between industrial and commercial properties.

Per Section 8-02-02 of the County' Development Standards and Regulations, a traffic study is required for rezoning of a property that generates more than 20 vehicle trips per day. Staff reviewed a trip generation projection provided by the applicant and has determined that the trips emanating from the proposed use will not exceed 20 vehicles per day. Therefore, the rezoning application did not require a full traffic impact study. In the event that the applicant's proposal changes, a traffic study will then be required when the applicant submits a building permit if the proposed development exceeds 20 vehicle trips per day.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on January 16, 2017. Mr. Tim Palermo, the applicant, and Mr. Russell Moore, the prospective tenant, attended the public hearing. Mr. Palermo stated that Mr. Russell's business is already located in the area, and the rezoning approval would allow the business to relocate onto subject property providing an opportunity for expansion. No one from the public was present to speak at the hearing. The Planning Commission voted (6-0) to recommend approval of the rezoning application.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Based upon the application, the criteria for approval of a rezoning, and a recent site visit, staff recommends approval of this request with 4 Findings-of-Fact.

SUMMARY OF PREVIOUS APPLICATIONS

On May 13, 1999, the Board of County Commissioners approved a conditional use permit to allow automobile repairs on the property for five years.

On June 16, 1999, the County issued building permits for existing structures on the subject property.

On November 21, 2011, the Board of County Commissioners approved three conditional use permits on the subject property for a period of five years. These conditional use permits were approved to allow a landscape storage yard, storage of seven vehicles exceeding 7,000 lbs, and stacking materials exceeding eight feet in height.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

Background

Dan Storjohann, the applicant, is requesting renewal of three conditional use permits, originally approved in 2011, which allowed: a landscape storage yard in the A-3 zone district, storage of seven commercial vehicles exceeding 7,000 lbs., and stacking of materials up to a maximum height of 12 feet. The current request includes an additional piece of equipment, which would allow eight vehicles and pieces of equipment stored on the property. The site is located on East 120th Avenue and approximately 1,000 feet east of Brighton Road.

The applicant currently owns and operates a landscaping business on the property. According to information provided with the application, the subject request primarily consists of hauling, selling, and delivering retail landscape materials. The landscape materials consist primarily of rock and mulch. In addition, the subject operation includes the storage of eight pieces of equipment used to deliver materials to customers. Overall, the business employs four full-time employees, one part-time maintenance person, and a part-time bookkeeper.

Development Standards and Regulations Requirements:

Section 3-07-01 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations requires a conditional use permit for operating a landscape storage yard in the A-3 zone district. Per Section 11-02-280, a landscape storage yard is defined as an unenclosed portion of the lot or parcel, upon which a landscape business owner maintains a principal office or a permanent business. Designating the lot or parcel as a landscape storage yard allows the area to be used to store and maintain construction equipment and other materials customarily used in the trade.

Performance standards guiding development and operation of landscape storage yards are outlined in Section 4-10-02-06-06 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations. Per this section of the County's Development Standards, a conditional use permit is required when two or more commercial vehicles or pieces of equipment in excess of seven thousand (7,000) pounds are used or operated in a land area of one acre or less. According to the applicant, there are currently eight vehicles and equipment over 7,000 pounds utilized on the property to support operation of the business, specifically: three tandem dump trucks, two trailers, a skid steer, a

loader, and a semi-end dump truck. Per Section 4-10-02-06-06 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, outdoor storage of rock, mulch, and equipment must be screened with an eight-foot high fence.

In addition, per Section 4-10-02-05-09 of the Development Standards and Regulations, a conditional use permit is required in order to store materials above a maximum height of eight feet in the A-3 zone district. The applicant is requesting stacking and storage of landscaping materials up to 12 feet in height. According to the applicant, allowing the requested height will provide an opportunity to maximize the use of the property. Currently, the property size is one acre and considered as legal non-conforming. In addition, a majority of the land area is occupied with two existing buildings, spaces for parking, and required landscaping. Only a small section of the property is reserved for storage; hence the request to allow stacking of storage material for a maximum height of 12 feet. This will accommodate the amount of materials needed to be stored on the property to make the business viable.

Currently, there is an eight-foot tall screen fence and a landscape buffer around the perimeter of the property. The fencing and landscaping serve as a visual buffer, restricting direct view of the storage area from being seen from adjacent right-of-ways. The landscaping on the property conforms to a landscaping plan approved with the conditional use permit in 2011. The stacking height of the outdoor storage is the same as the height approved with the conditional use permit in 2011.

Existing development of the property includes 990 sq. ft. of warehousing, 944 sq. ft. of office space, and 14,982 sq. ft. of outdoor storage. According to the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual, the existing development generates an estimated 132 vehicles per day. Per Section 8-02-02 of the County's Development Standards and Regulation, new development applications that generate more than 250 vehicles per day shall require a Level 3 traffic impact study. There are no changes to the existing development as proposed with this conditional use permit; and therefore, no increase in traffic generation is expected.

Comprehensive Plan:

The future land use designation on the property is Estate Residential. Per Chapter 5 of the County's Comprehensive Plan, Estate Residential areas are designated for single-family housing at densities less than one unit per acre. Estate Residential areas are intended to provide opportunities for rural lifestyles in the County.

The request to continue operations of an existing landscape storage yard would not present a negative impact on the goals of the Comprehensive Plan for this area, as the existing use is compatible with other uses, which are currently found in the area. The proposed use also includes screen fencing and landscape buffering which will limit the visibility of the use as the area becomes increasingly residential.

Site Characteristics:

East 120th Avenue abuts the southern side of the site. E.120th is classified as a local street. The property has one access point, which is onto East 120th Avenue. There are currently two existing structures on the property. These structures are used for offices and indoor storage of equipment.

Compatibility with Surrounding Land Uses:

The subject property is surrounded by land primarily used for agriculture and properties with no established use. Directly east of the site are several small sheds, which are utilized for agricultural storage. There are also industrial uses located approximately 400 feet west of the site. A mining operation (Henderson Pit) is located approximately 150 feet east of the property. This mining operation has been on the adjacent property since 2003. The request to allow landscape yard storage and equipment on the subject property is not out of character with the surrounding area. Additionally, the property has been used by this business as a landscape storage yard for the past five years with no complaints or zoning violations.

Referral Comments

Adams County staff reviewed the subject request and all staff concerns have been resolved. A site inspection was performed on November 13, 2016. The screen fencing was well-maintained, and existing landscaping was living and properly maintained.

The Tri-County Health Department reviewed the request and recommended to the applicant to create a plan for regular pest control, due to possible health concerns that can be generated by outdoor storage uses.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on January 12, 2017 and unanimously recommended approval. Mr. Daniel Storjohann, the applicant and owner, spoke at the public hearing. No other person from the public was present to speak at the hearing. During the hearing Commissioner Thompson asked the applicant to explain the likelihood that the outdoor storage materials would exceed the height of the existing screening fence on the property. Mr. Storjohann stated that he rarely stores landscape materials that exceeds eight feet in height; however, he

prefers to have the flexibility to store up to such height. Commissioner Garner complimented Mr. Storjohann on keeping the property clean all the time.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Based upon the application, the criteria for approval of a conditional use permit, and a recent site visit, staff recommends approval of this request with 8 Findings-of-Fact, 6 Conditions, and 1 Note.

Findings-of-Fact:

- 1. The conditional use is permitted in the applicable zone district.
- 2. The conditional use is consistent with the purposes of these standards and regulations.
- 3. The conditional use will comply with the requirements of these standards and regulations, including but not limited to, all applicable performance standards.
- 4. The conditional use is compatible with the surrounding area, harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, not detrimental to the immediate area, not detrimental to the future development of the area, and not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants of the area and the County.
- 5. The conditional use permit has addressed all off-site impacts.
- 6. The site is suitable for the proposed conditional use including adequate usable space, adequate access, and absence of environmental constraints.
- 7. The site plan for the proposed conditional use will provide the most convenient and functional use of the lot including the parking scheme, traffic circulation, open space, fencing, screening, landscaping, signage, and lighting.
- 8. Sewer, water, storm water drainage, fire protection, police protection, and roads are to be available and adequate to serve the needs of the conditional use as designed and proposed.

Recommended Conditions of Approval:

- 1. The Conditional Use Permit shall expire on January 31, 2022, at which time; the applicant may reapply for a new Conditional Use Permit if the use is still compatible with the surrounding area.
- 2. All outdoor storage of vehicles and/or equipment over 7,000 pounds gross vehicle weight shall be located on the southwestern corner of the property. The vehicles shall be stored, at a minimum, on a gravel surface or other surface as approved by Community and Economic Development Department.
- 3. Stacking of materials shall be limited to a maximum height of 12 feet.
- 4. A dust suppression system shall be established to restrict the amount of dust generated by vehicles/equipment while driving and parking on a gravel surface.
- 5. The applicant shall be responsible for the maintenance and removal of any debris within 250 feet of the subject property's access on 120th Avenue.
- 6. The applicant shall formulate a vector control plan in conjunction with the Tri-County Health Department by April 30, 2017.

Recommended Notes to the Applicant:

1. All applicable building, zoning, engineering, fire, and health codes shall be adhered to with this request.

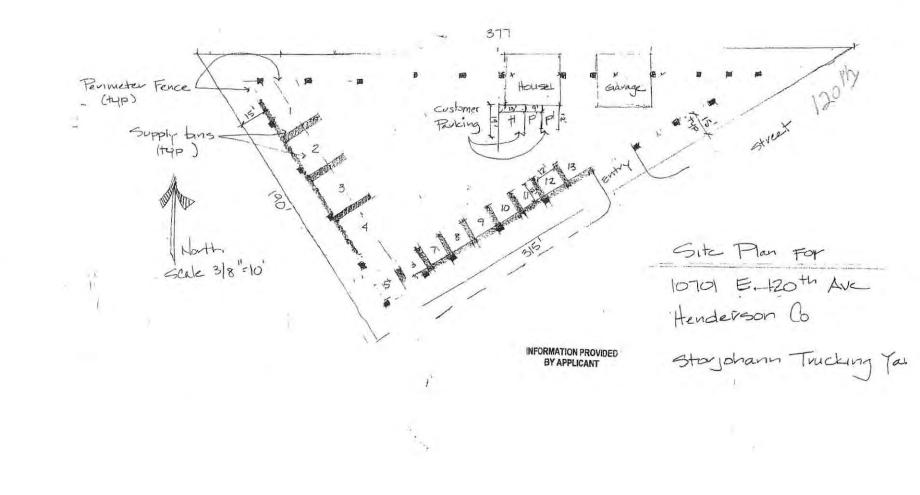

PLN01: The subject property at 10701 E 120th Avenue is located within the Agricultural-3 (A-3) zone district. Pursuant to Section 3-07-01 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations (DSR), a Conditional Use Permit is required for a Landscape Storage Yard located within the A-3 Zone district. (informational, no action further necessary)

PLN02: Section 4-10-02-06-06 of the DSR lists specific performance standards for Landscape Storage Yards. This section includes language that states, "In all Agricultural Zone Districts no more than two (2) commercial vehicles and/or equipment in excess of seven thousand (7,000) pounds gross vehicle weight used for the landscape storage yard business shall be allowed per acre with a maximum of five (5) unless otherwise permitted through a Conditional Use Permit." Information provided in your application indicates that a Conditional Use Permit is being pursued to exceed the number of commercial vehicles permitted by right. (informational, no further action necessary)

PLN03: Section 4-10-02-05-09 of the DSR outlines specific rules for Outdoor Storage in excess of 100% of the Building Area. These requirements state that a conditional use permit is required where storage materials exceed the height of the screen fencing. The proposed material height can be a maximum of 16 feet, and therefore a conditional use permit will be required. (Informational, no further action necessary.)

PLN04: A site inspection was performed on November 15, 2016. Existing landscaping was properly maintained and healthy. The condition of the screen fencing was acceptable by Adams County standards. (no further action necessary).

PLN05: The proposed use is consistent with the Adams County DSR specific performance standards for a Landscape Storage Yard found in Section 4-10-02-06-06, so long as the conditional use permits are obtained. Additionally, the proposed site meets the standards for parking and landscaping. (no further action necessary)

Rodents such as mice and rats carry diseases which can be spread to humans through contact with rodents, rodent feces, urine, or saliva, or through rodent bites. Items stored on the ground, tightly packed, and rarely moved provide potential harborage for rodents. Due to the variety of items to be stored at this site, TCHD recommends that the applicant create a plan for regular pest control. - 3. Stacking of materials shall be limited to a maximum height of 12 feet.
- 4. A dust suppression system shall be established to restrict the amount of dust generated by vehicles/equipment while driving and parking on a gravel surface.
- 5. The applicant shall be responsible for the maintenance and removal of any debris within 250 feet of the subject property's access on 120th Avenue.
- 6. The applicant shall formulate a vector control plan in conjunction with the Tri-County Health Department by April 30, 2017.
