WHEREAS, Adams County owns property ("the Property") known as Adams County Regional Park and Golf Course at the intersection of Yosemite Street and Riverdale Road located in the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 1 South, Range 67 West of the 6th Principal Meridian as described in the attached easement; and,

WHEREAS, Brighton School District 27J ("District"), a Colorado school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, is constructing School District 27J – High School #3; and,

WHEREAS, the District, wishes to construct and maintain storm water drainage facilities within the Property for the benefit of the high school project; and,

WHEREAS, the District understands and agrees that the easement crosses the Adams County Regional Park and Golf Course property and shall be subordinate to Adams County's right to maintain the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the attached easement between Brighton School District 27J and Adams County, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, be and hereby is approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair is authorized to execute said easement on behalf of Adams County.

EASEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF STORM WATER DRAINAGE FACILITIES

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That The **County of Adams**, State of Colorado, a body politic, hereinafter called "Grantor" for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100's Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable considerations in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to **Brighton School District 27J**, a Colorado school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, whose address is 18551 E. 160th Avenue, Brighton, Colorado 80601, hereinafter called "Grantee" its successors and assigns, a permanent storm water drainage easement and right-of-way including the perpetual right to enter upon the real estate hereinafter described at any time it may see fit and construct, maintain, service and repair all drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., through and under the lands hereinafter described:

Legal description as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

The Grantee hereby covenants and agrees:

- (a) Grantee shall promptly backfill any excavation and/or trench made by it on said easement area and shall promptly repair or replace any damage it shall do to Grantor's property such as but not limited to fences, bridges, culverts, roads or lanes and shall leave the surface of said easement in a neat and orderly vegetated condition and at the same elevation and contour following completion of any work performed, except as necessarily modified to accommodate the infrastructure and appurtenances installed.
- (b) Grantee shall promptly repair or replace any damage it shall do to Grantor's property caused by ingress to and egress from said easement and shall restore said damaged land and or property to its original condition.
- (c) Grantee understands that the easement crosses Adams County Regional Park and Golf Course property. Grantee's easement shall be subordinate to Grantor's rights to maintain said park and golf course amenities. Grantee shall take no action, and shall install no infrastructure, that, in the sole discretion of Grantor, impedes or interferes with Regional Park or Golf Course operations.
- (d) Grantee agrees to continuously maintain the drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., once a year and, after a major storm event. The Grantee agrees to inspect and if necessary, remove any sediment and debris and, if necessary, perform any work required to ensure the property operations of the drainage facilities.

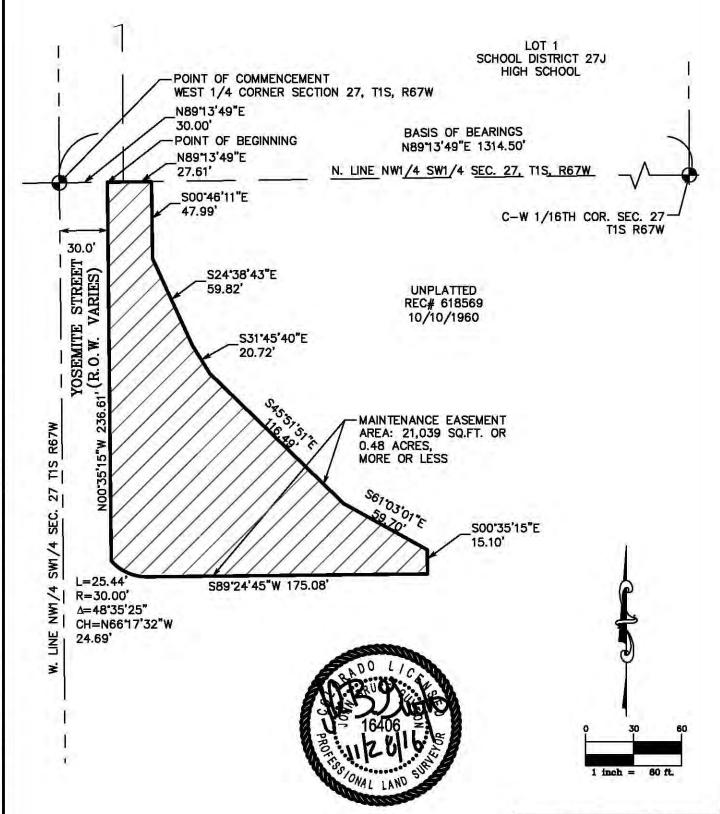

WHEREAS, Brighton School District 27J ("District"), a Colorado school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, is required to make road safety improvements of the intersection of Yosemite Street and Riverdale Road for its School District 27J – High School #3 project; and,

WHEREAS, a portion the Property is also being used for storm water drainage facilities and improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the District, wishes to construct a new roadway intersection and storm water drainage facilities within the Property; and,

WHEREAS, the District understands and agrees that the easement crosses the Adams County Regional Park and Golf Course and shall be subordinate to Adams County's right to maintain the Property.

A. Grantor is the owner of property (the "Premises"), and desires to protect the Premises and to preserve the future use of said Premises, which is more particularly described as follows:

A portion of the property described in the Warranty Deed recorded in Book 871 at Page 488 of the records in the Office of the Clerk and Recorder of Adams County, Colorado, said parcel having Assessor Parcel No. 0157127200005.

B. Grantee desires to install a public roadway and storm sewer facilities in, under, or along portions of the Premises as more particularly shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and desires to obtain Grantor's permission therefore.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Grantor hereby grants to Grantee, its contractors and subcontractors, with respect to such interest as Grantor may have in the Premises, a temporary construction easement and the right-of-entry for the purpose of constructing a Roadway – Yosemite St and Riverdale Road Intersection and related appurtenances, together with storm sewer facilities in, on, under, or along the Premises, subject to the following:

- (1) Grantee shall bear the sole cost and obligation of obtaining such permits and land use approvals as required for the licensed facility. Grantee agrees that any authorization granted herein is subject to Grantee obtaining such additional authorization. Grantee shall be solely responsible for the costs of installing, constructing, and maintaining the licensed facility.
- (2) Grantor intends to use the Premises for governmental purposes, and the rights herein granted to Grantee for the use of the Premises are subject to the rights of Grantor to use the Premises for such purposes, which rights Grantor hereby expressly reserves.
- (3) Grantee shall not do or permit to be done any blasting on the Premises without first having received prior written permission from Grantor. Any blasting shall be done in the presence of a representative of Grantor and in accordance with directions such representative may give for the protection or safety of facilities in the area.
- (4) Any damage to the Premises, as a result of the construction, operation, maintenance, repair, inspection, removal, replacement, or relocation of the licensed facility shall be paid for or repaired at the expense of Grantee.
- (5) Grantee shall promptly repair or replace all damage it shall do to Grantor's property such as but not limited to fences, bridges, culverts, roads or lanes and shall leave the surface of said easement in

a neat and orderly condition and at the same elevation and contours following completion of any work performed

- (6) Grantee understands that said use of a portion of Grantor's property is only as specified in School District 27J High School #3 E 136th Avenue and Yosemite Street Construction Plans as approved by Adams County.
- (8) Grantee shall restore damaged land and/or property to its original condition and re-vegetate any and all disturbed non farmed areas with a native grass mixture as specified by the Adams County Parks Department.
- (9) Grantee shall construct, as specified by the Grantor, a temporary fence along the temporary easement boundary of this easement to provide limits of construction activities.
 - (10) (a) (i) As used in this license, the term "Claims" means (1) losses, liabilities, and expenses of any sort, including attorneys' fees; (2) fines and penalties; (3) environmental costs, including, but not limited to, investigation, removal, remedial, and restoration costs, and consultant and other fees and expenses; and (4) any and all other costs or expenses.
 - (ii) As used in this license, the term "Injury" means (1) death, personal injury, or property damage; (2) loss of profits or other economic injury; (3) disease or actual or threatened health effect; and (4) any consequential or other damages.
 - (b) To the extent allowed by law, Grantee covenants and agrees to at all times protect, indemnify, hold harmless, and defend Grantor, its directors, officers, agents, employees, successors, assigns, parents, subsidiaries, and affiliates from and against any and all Claims arising from, alleged to arise from, or related to any Injury allegedly or actually occurring, imposed as a result of, arising from, or related to (1) this license; (2) the construction, existence, maintenance, operation, repair, inspection, removal, replacement, or relocation of the licensed facility; or (3) Grantee's or any other person's presence at the Premises as a result of or related to this license.
 - (c) Grantee's duty to protect, indemnify, hold harmless, and defend hereunder shall apply to any and all Claims and Injury arising from, or alleged to be arising in any way from, the acts or omissions of Grantee, its sublessees, invitees, agents, or employees, including, but not limited to:
 - (i) Claims asserted by any person or entity, including, but not limited to, employees of Grantee or its contractors, subcontractors, or their employees;
 - (ii) Claims arising from, or alleged to be arising in any way from, the existence at or near the Premises of the licensed facility.
- (11) Venue for any dispute regarding this license or claims arising therefrom shall be in Adams County, Colorado.
- (12) This agreement is not transferable or assignable without the express written permission of Grantor.

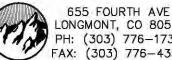

BACKGROUND:

School District 27J has requested to enter into an agreement with Adams County for the construction of public and private improvements on a County property. The proposed public and private improvements will support the development of Adams County District's High School No. 3, located northeast of the intersection of Yosemite St. and Riverdale Rd. Exhibit B of the Development Agreement (DA) describes the public improvements required during construction of the development. These improvements include drainage and street construction to the intersection of Riverdale Rd and Yosemite Street.

As a requirement of the Development Agreement, the Developer shall furnish to the County a performance bond, releasable only by the County, to guarantee compliance with this Agreement. Said collateral shall be in the initial amount of four hundred and fifty two thousand seventy eight dollars and 40 cents (\$452,078.40).

WHEREAS, it is provided by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, that where designated the Developer shall have entered into a written agreement with the County to install public and/or private improvements, and to deed land for public purposes or right-of-way or submit cash-in-lieu; and,

WHEREAS, the Developer has provided collateral to meet the terms of the agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Community and Economic Development Department recommends approval of the attached Development Agreement for School District 27J's High School No. 3, case No. SIA2016-00016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Development Agreement for School District 27J, High School No. 3, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, be approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners be authorized to execute this AGREEMENT on behalf of the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the County of Adams, State of Colorado, hereinafter called "County," and School District 27J, 18551 E. 160th Ave., Brighton, CO 80601, hereinafter called "Developer."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of real property in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.

WHEREAS, it is provided by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, that where designated the Developer shall have entered into a written agreement with the County to install public and/or private improvements, and to deed land for public purposes or right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto promise, covenant, and agree as follows:

- 1. **Engineering Services**. Developer shall furnish, at its own expense, all engineering and other services in connection with the design and construction of the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. **Drawings and Estimates**. The Developer shall furnish drawings and cost estimates for all improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" for approval by the County. Upon request, the Developer shall furnish one set of reproducible "as built" drawings and a final statement of construction costs to the County.
- 3. **Construction**. Developer shall furnish and construct, at its own expense and in accordance with drawings and materials approved by the County, the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B".
- 4. **Time for Completion**. Improvements shall be completed according to the terms of this agreement within "July 31st, 2017" appearing in Exhibit "B". The County may for good cause grant extension of time for completion of any part or all of improvements appearing on said Exhibit "B". Any extension of time shall be in written form only.
- 5. Guarantee of Compliance. Developer shall furnish to the County a cash escrow deposit or other acceptable collateral, releasable only by the County, to guarantee compliance with this agreement. Said collateral shall be in the amount of \$452,078.40, including twenty percent (20%) to cover administration and five percent (5%) per year for the term of the Agreement to cover inflation. Upon completion of said improvements constructed according to the terms of this agreement, and preliminary acceptance by the Director of the Transportation Department in accordance with section 5-02-06-01 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, the collateral shall be released. Completion of said improvements shall be determined solely by the County, and a reasonable part of said collateral, up to 20%, may be retained to guarantee maintenance of public improvements for a period of one year from the date of completion.

No construction, building or change-in-use permits shall be issued until said collateral is furnished in the amount required and in a form acceptable to the Board of County Commissioners.

6. Acceptance and Maintenance of Public Improvements. All roadway improvements designated "public" on Exhibit "B" shall be public facilities and become the property of the County or other public agencies upon acceptance. During the period of one year from and after the acceptance of public improvements, the Developer shall, at its own expense, make all needed repairs or replacement due to defective materials or workmanship which, in the opinion of the County, becomes necessary. If, within ten days of written notice to the Developer from the County requesting such repairs or replacements, the Developer has not

undertaken with due diligence to make the same, the County may make such repairs or replacements at the Developer's expense. In the case of an emergency such written notice may be waived.

All other improvements designated as "private" in Exhibit "B" shall be privately owned and maintained by the Developer. All private improvements on County property must be located with an easement(s) granted by the County.

- 7. **Successors and Assigns**. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the Developer, and shall be deemed a covenant running with the real property as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 8. **Improvements and Dedication**. The undersigned Developer hereby agrees to provide the following public and private improvements on County property, and to dedicate described easements.

A. Improvements.

- 1. Public Improvements:
 - a. Construction of the Riverdale Road and Yosemite Street Intersection and, storm sewer facilities capable of conveying the major (100-year) event under Riverdale Road, and the minor (5-year) event storm flows from the north side of the intersection of Riverdale Rd. and Yosemite St. to the Brantner Gulch, south of Riverdale Rd. These improvements are to be completed by 09/31/2017. See Exhibit "B" for description, estimated quantities and estimated construction costs.

The design and construction of all roadway improvements listed above and located within unincorporated Adams County must be reviewed and approved by the County. Upon completion of the above listed improvements and acceptance of the improvements by the Director of the Transportation Department, the public improvements listed above shall become the property of the County.

- 2. Private Improvements:
 - a. Detention pond outfall stilling basin located just east of the High School No. 3 detention pond in the Brantner Gulch Tributary No.
 7.

Privately Constructed Public Improvements:

b. Confluence pond/basin (pond) located at the northeast corner of the intersections of Riverdale Rd. and Yosemite St.

See Exhibit "B" for description, estimated quantities and estimated construction costs.

The private improvements and privately constructed public improvements list above shall be reviewed and approved by the County prior to construction. The private improvements shall be constructed in accordance with all County requirements and specifications in accordance with the County approved plans and time schedule indicated in Exhibit "B".

B. **Public dedication of easements**. Upon approval of this agreement by the Board of County Commissioners, the County hereby agrees to dedicate to the Developer permanent access and drainage easements for the purposes of providing maintenance to the private improvements listed in items 8.2.a and 8.2.b., listed above. See Exhibit "C" for descriptions of these easements.

9. **Maintenance of Public Improvements**: The Developer agrees to maintain all improvements located on Adams County property and permitted by this agreement, during the construction phase of the High School and through the County's warranty period. The improvements approved by Adams County and located on Adams County property are listed in item 8.A.1. and 8.A.2. above.

The Developer agrees to continuously maintain the private improvements and privately constructed public improvements listed in item 8.A.2. Maintenance shall include the following: Once a year and, after a major storm event, the developer agrees to inspect and if necessary remove any sediment and debris and, if necessary perform any work required to ensure the proper operation of these facilities.

10. **Change from Parks Use to Road Right-of-Way.** Upon approval and acceptance of this Agreement, the Board of County Commissioners hereby consents to the Developer converting the use of the following County land from Parks use to road right-of-way for the purpose of constructing road safety improvements:

WHEREAS, Adams County owns property ("the Property") known as Adams County Riverdale Bluffs Open Space adjacent to Riverdale Road located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 1 South, Range 67 West of the 6th Principal Meridian as described in the attached easement deed; and,

WHEREAS, Brighton School District 27J ("District"), a Colorado school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, is constructing School District 27J – High School #3; and,

WHEREAS, the District, wishes to construct and maintain storm water drainage facilities within the Property for the benefit of the high school project; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the attached easement deed between Brighton School District 27J and Adams County, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, be and hereby is approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair is authorized to execute said easement deed on behalf of Adams County.

<u>EASEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE</u> OF STORM WATER DRAINAGE FACILITIES – OPEN SPACE

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That The **County of Adams**, State of Colorado, a body politic, hereinafter called "Grantor" for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100's Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable considerations in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to **Brighton School District 27J**, a Colorado school district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, whose address is 18551 E. 160th Avenue, Brighton, Colorado 80601, hereinafter called "Grantee," its successors and assigns, a permanent storm water drainage easement and right-of-way including the perpetual right to enter upon the real estate hereinafter described at any time it may see fit and construct, maintain, service and repair all drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., through and under the lands hereinafter described:

Legal description as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

The Grantee hereby covenants and agrees:

- (a) Grantee shall promptly backfill any excavation and/or trench made by it on said easement area and shall promptly repair or replace any damage it does to Grantor's property such as but not limited to fences, bridges, culverts, roads or lanes and shall leave the surface of said easement in a neat and orderly vegetated condition and at the same elevation and contour following completion of any work performed, except as necessarily modified to accommodate the infrastructure and appurtenances installed.

Grantee further acknowledges that the drainage easement shall be subordinate to the Deed of Conservation Easement on said open space that was granted by Grantor to the City of Commerce City on September 24, 2012, and recorded in the Adams County Clerk and Recorder's Office at Reception Number 2012000077655 and re-recorded at Reception Number 2013000048483.
- (d) Grantee agrees to continuously maintain the drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., once a year and, after a major storm event. The Grantee agrees to inspect and if necessary, remove any sediment and debris and, if necessary, perform any work required to ensure the property operations of the drainage facilities.

- (e) In the event the County requires maintenance of the drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., all of the County's costs to maintain the drainage facilities shall be reimbursed by Grantor within thirty days of receiving the County's invoice, including any collection costs and attorney fees.
- (f) Grantee, its successors, assigns, employees and contractors shall, to the extent permitted by law, indemnify and hold Grantor harmless for, from and against any liability for damages, loss or expense, arising from damage to property or injury or death of any person or persons, arising out of, or in any way connected with or resulting from the Grantee's construction, operation, maintenance, repair, or replacement of the pipeline and its appurtenances.

The provisions hereof shall inure to the benefit of and bind the successors and assigns of the respective parties hereto and all covenants shall apply to and run with the land.

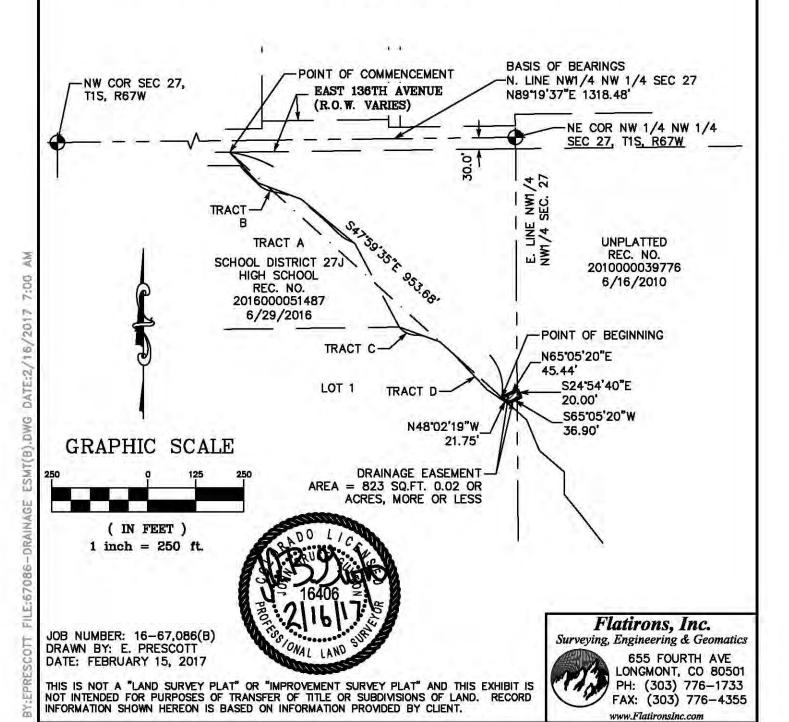

BACKGROUND:

The County purchased the former Phoenix Center community corrections facility located at 8031 Highway I-76 in January of 2016. There is currently a female program operating out of one of the wings of the building, as renovations are ongoing in the remainder of the building. It was discovered that the former bus stop at the corner of Dahlia and the I-76 frontage road near the facility was no longer in service. Jeanne Shreve is facilitating ongoing communication with RTD to restore the service, with no resolution to date.

Female clients must walk approximately 1.2-1.5 miles to the nearest bus stop along busy streets with few sidewalks, little lighting, and heavy traffic to go to work and treatment classes. Clients are required to work, but not allowed to drive. After several reported incidents, the County agreed to hire two temporary part-time drivers to shuttle the clients to the park and ride at Highway 85 and 72^{nd} Avenue in Commerce City during peak hours as a **temporary** solution to the problem.

The long-term solution is to continue negotiations with RTD expressing the importance of reinstating the bus stop as the building is completed and the occupancy of the building increases. There will be a capacity of 184 beds upon completion of the project offering a captive clientele for RTD ridership.

The operator of the program, Time to Change, Inc. offered the use a van to serve clients needing transportation. This agreement outlines the conditions for the use of that vehicle by the County employed drivers.

RESOLUTION APPROVING AGREEMENT FOR VEHICLE USE BETWEEN ADAMS COUNTY AND TIME TO CHANGE, INC.

WHEREAS, Time to Change, Inc. is operating a community corrections program serving a female population at the County owned community corrections facility ("Facility") located at 8031 Highway I-76; and,

WHEREAS, RTD has discontinued and eliminated a bus stop at the corner of Dahlia and the I-76 Frontage Road that served the Facility; and,

WHEREAS, while efforts to reinstate the bus stop with RTD are being pursued, the County has agreed to provide a temporary part-time driver for peak morning hours and a temporary part-time driver for peak afternoon/evening hours in order to transport residents of the Facility from the Facility to the Park and Ride located at Highway US 85 and 72nd Avenue in Commerce City; and,

WHEREAS, Time to Change, Inc. has offered their van for use by the County employed parttime drivers until renovation of the Facility is complete and a certificate of occupancy is obtained for full building use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Vehicle Use Agreement between the Board of County Commissioners and Time to Change, Inc., which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is herby approved and the Chair is herby authorized to execute same.

VEHICLE USE AGREEMENT

THIS VEHICLE USE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is between Time To Change, Inc. (the "Vehicle Owner") and Adams County, Colorado ("County") and collectively the "Parties".

WHEREAS, Vehicle Owner provides certain services to occupants of a Community Corrections facility owned by County; and,

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the provision of certain services to occupants of the community corrections facility owned by the County, the County seeks to use a van owned by the Vehicle Owner to transfer individuals from the community corrections facility to a nearby bus stop; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle Owner is amenable to allowing County to use its vehicle to transport occupants of the community corrections facility to the bus stop.

Accordingly, in consideration for the use of Vehicle Owner's vehicle, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. County's Responsibilities. County shall be responsible for any and all costs or damages incurred by Vehicle Owner resulting from actions of County employed drivers while such drivers are operating Vehicle Owner's van. The County agrees to be solely responsible for any claims that may arise based on the actions of a County employed driver while said driver is operating Vehicle Owner's Van.
- **2. Worker's Compensation.** County shall provide all Statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance coverage required in Colorado for any person operating the Vehicle. Such insurance shall contain an endorsement waiving subrogation against Vehicle Owner.
- **3. Insurance.** Vehicle Owner shall maintain automobile insurance on the vehicle that covers any County employed drivers mutually agreed to by both parties as a suitable driver for stated purposes. This insurance shall be purchased and maintained at Vehicle Owner's sole expense.
- **4. Licenses, Safety and Health.** County represents and warrants that its employees, contractors, agents and agents' employees who will use the Vehicle Owner's vehicle are properly licensed to operate said vehicle and have received any training required by any federal, state or local agency for the operation of a vehicle and the transportation of persons contemplated by this Agreement, including PREA training as required.
- **5. Duration.** This Agreement is designed to be short term and shall terminate on the day that the building received a Certificate of Occupancy or can be cancelled by either party with three days written notice.

- **6. Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted according to the laws of the State of Colorado.
- 7. Severability. If for any reason, any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Agreement not so held invalid, and each such other provision shall to the full extent consistent with law continue in full force and effect, unless the provision is material and its invalidity results in substantial economic detriment to any party, in which event the parties agree to negotiate in good faith a reasonable resolution.
- **8. No Third Party Beneficiaries.** The parties to this Agreement have not entered into this Agreement for the benefit of any third party and do not intend that any benefits of this Agreement inure to the benefit of any third party.
- **9. Amendment.** This Amendment shall not be altered, waived, amended or extended, except by written agreement signed by both parties.
- 10. Entire Agreement. The parties acknowledge that they have read this Agreement, understand it, and agree to be bound by its terms, conditions, and covenants, and also agree that it constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all proposals, oral or written, and all prior negotiations, conversations, or discussions between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement.

In 2003, there were 232 cases of West Nile Virus reported in Adams County. At that time, the County implemented an aggressive mosquito control program. In 2015, there were only 5 cases of West Nile Virus in Adams County reported to Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

A solicitation was performed in 2015 and Ottertail Environmental Inc., was awarded the agreement for the mosquito control services. In 2016, Vector Disease Control International (VDCI) purchased Ottertail Environmental Inc., and provided mosquito control services under the same agreement for the first renewal year. The original contract allowed up to four one-year renewal options.

The Community and Economic Development Department finds the services provided by VDCI satisfactory. Staff recommends the second renewal option be approved with VDCI in the not to exceed amount of \$213,075.07, which is within budget. VDCI is holding their 2016 fees for 2017.

If the property owner is not in compliance, then Neighborhood Services will contact the contracted vendor to come out to the property to mow weeds, remove brush, litter and debris, repair fences and bring the property back into compliance.

In May of 2016, an agreement was awarded to Ground Services Company to provide Blight Violation Services for Adams County. The Community and Economic Development Department finds the services provided by Grounds Services Company satisfactory.

- Focus on the family strengths by directing intensive services that support and strengthen the family and protect the child(ren);
- Prevent out-of-home placement of the child(ren);
- Return child(ren) in placement to their own home;
- Unite child(ren) with their permanent families; or,
- Provide services that protect the child(ren)

- Focus on the family strengths by directing intensive services that support and strengthen the family and protect the child(ren);
- Prevent out-of-home placement of the child(ren);
- Return child(ren) in placement to their own home;
- Unite child(ren) with their permanent families; or,
- Provide services that protect the child(ren)
