General Permit Requirements

### **HOUSEHOLD PETS**

Household pets generally include cats, dogs, guinea pigs, chinchillas, ferrets, and rabbits. **However, the maximum number of cats and dogs is regulated by property size and zone district**. You must follow the Private Kennel and Cattery regulations if you have more than 10 cats or dogs.

The chart above summarizes the maximum number of cats and dogs permitted on a property. The maximum number of household pets is regulated based on zone district and property size. # HOUSEHOLD PET KEEPING FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Can I have a pot-bellied pig?

• Pot-bellied pigs are considered swine and are not allowed in residential zone districts.

### **Can I have poisonous animals?**

• Any venomous or lethal animals, including poisonous and/or constrictor snakes, lizards, toads, or arachnids, are prohibited per Section 11-02-412.

# **LIVESTOCK ANIMAL KEEPING TABLE AND CHARTS**

**Definition:** Includes alpacas, beefalo, bison, burros, cattle, chickens, deer, ducks, geese, elk, emus, goats, horses, llamas, mules, ostriches, sheep, swine, turkeys, etc.

### **How do I calculate Livestock Units?**

Animal units establish an equivalent density for various species of livestock.

Animal Type	# of Animals in 1 Unit	
Sheep and Swine	4 animals	
Goats	8 animals	
Ducks, Geese, Turkey, Chickens/Roosters	50 animals	
Bees (Colonies)	5 colonies	
Cattle, Bison, Other Livestock	1 animal	
Horses, Llamas, Alpacas, Mules	1 animal

# LIVESTOCK ANIMAL KEEPING FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Where are livestock animals allowed?

- Agricultural (A-1, A-2, A-3) over 0.5 acres
- Residential Estate (R-E) over 1 acre

### Can I have chickens/roosters at my property?

Poultry and/or livestock is allowed only in the Agricultural and Residential Estate zone districts.

#### Can I have bees/colonies?

- Allowed in Agricultural, Residential Estate, and Single-Family Residential zone districts
- Property must be at least 1 acre in size
- Number of colonies is limited by property size

### What are the sanitation requirements?

Manure - All manure shall be removed periodically or incorporated into the soil on a regular basis so the manure does not draw flies and other insects or cause obnoxious odors.

### Do animal structures need a permit?

- All structures over 200 square feet require a building permit
- All structures must meet the required setback regulations
- All fences and walls over 42 inches in height require a building permit
