How to apply	Household must apply for, or already be receiving, Colorado Works. The customer does not need to be determined eligible for CW to qualify for Disaster Assistance.  A referral will be routed to the Workforce and Business Center for review and determination.	Household must apply for financial assistance (TANF/Colorado Works) through Adams County Human Services.  If customer is determined ineligible for TANF a referral will be made for EBA and routed to the Workforce and Business Center for review and determination. Eligible Services	Assistance may include, but is not limited to the following types of assistance:  • purchase or lease of shelter; home renovations (within the existing footprint);  • transportation (including car repairs and purchase); non-covered medical expenses;  • work-related supplies that were lost or damaged;  • counseling services;  • non-medical mental health services.		<ul> <li>Training tuition, pre-employment, and employment needs</li> <li>Application fees</li> <li>Books/Lab fees</li> <li>HSP prep and testing; ESL classes</li> <li>Educational and employment supplies</li> <li>Tools</li> <li>Professional licensing and certifications</li> <li>Uniforms</li> </ul>

## If you believe a family may benefit from CEDP or EBA programs:

- 1. Advise customer to apply for TANF/Colorado Works with Adams County. Applications can be submitted in person, through the mail or online via PEAK (https://coloradopeak.secure.force.com)
- 2. Inform the customer that even if they are not eligible to receive TANF they may still qualify for one of the programs above.
- 3. Advise the customer to request a referral for Disaster Assistance or EBA during their eligibility interview. The customer should be prepared to explain their circumstances (their short-term financial need and how it relates to COVID-19) during the interview. Submit EBA referrals by completing an EBA 2020 Emergency Assistance Referral and sending it to WBC-EBA@adcogov.org
- 4. The customer must provide all the requested documentation and complete the eligibility process.
